Public Health - <u>Report on Establishing a Directory of</u> Home Health Care Providers - <u>Directory</u>

- FOR the purpose of requiring the Maryland Department of Health to establish and maintain an online directory of each home health care provider; requiring that the directory allow an individual to search the directory and identify a home health care provider based on specified criteria submit a report on the feasibility of establishing and maintaining an online directory of home health care providers for certain purposes to certain committees of the General Assembly on or before a certain date; and generally relating to home health care providers.
