Barbers and Cosmetologists – License Qualifications – Domestic Violence Awareness Training

4 FOR the purpose of requiring the State Board of Barbers and the State Board of $\mathbf{5}$ Cosmetologists to require as a qualification for licensure an applicant to complete 6 certain training in domestic violence awareness; requiring the Maryland 7 Department of Labor to develop and administer certain domestic violence awareness 8 training that includes certain guidance; requiring the State Board of Barbers and 9 the State Board of Cosmetologists to require certain licensees to complete a one-time training requirement to renew a certain license; and generally relating to licensing 1011 qualifications for barbers and cosmetologists.

(b) The State Board of Cosmetologists shall require an individual who holds a
license or limited license issued under Title 5 of the Business Occupations and Professions
Article before October 1, 2025, to complete the domestic violence awareness training under
§ 5–305.1 of the Business Occupations and Professions Article, as enacted by Section 1 of
this Act, as a requirement for only the next renewal of the license or limited license.
