### 1 AN ACT concerning

### 2 Anne Arundel County – Alcoholic Beverages Licenses – Veterans' Organizations

3 FOR the purpose of authorizing a certain holder of a Class C beer, wine, and liquor license 4 in Anne Arundel County to convert the license to a Class C (veterans' organization)  $\mathbf{5}$ license; altering the annual license fee for a Class C (veterans' organization) license; 6 authorizing the Board of License Commissioners for Anne Arundel County to provide 7 application and administrative fee discounts to certain licensees and applicants; 8 authorizing the holder of a Class C (veterans' organization) license to operate on 9 Sunday without obtaining a Sunday license; and generally relating to alcoholic 10 beverages licenses in Anne Arundel County.

19 (c) (1) [A] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN PARAGRAPH (4) OF THIS 20 SUBSECTION, A holder of a Class C beer, wine, and liquor license may sell beer, wine, and 21 liquor on Monday through Saturday from 6 a.m. to 2 a.m. the following day.

22 (2) Except as provided in [paragraph] **PARAGRAPHS** (3) **AND** (4) of this 23 subsection, the license holder may not sell beer, wine, or liquor after 2 a.m. on Sunday.

(3) The Board may issue to the license holder a Sunday license that
authorizes the sale of beer, wine, and liquor on Sunday according to terms that the license
states.

(4) A HOLDER OF A CLASS C (VETERANS' ORGANIZATION) LICENSE
UNDER § 11–1009 OF THIS TITLE MAY SELL BEER, WINE, AND LIQUOR ON MONDAY
THROUGH SUNDAY FROM 6 A.M. TO 2 A.M. THE FOLLOWING DAY WITHOUT
OBTAINING A SUNDAY LICENSE UNDER PARAGRAPH (3) OF THIS SUBSECTION.

31 [(4)] (5) The license holder may sell or provide beer, wine, and liquor at a 32 bar or counter on any day on which the sale of beer, wine, and liquor is allowed by law. 1 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 2 1, 2025.
