- 3 FOR the purpose of specifying that property damage that results from an accident that 4 involves certain vessels includes damage to navigational aid markers, lights, or 5 identifiers for purposes of a certain reporting requirement; and generally relating to 6 reporting property damage that results from an accident that involves certain 7 vessels.

- 13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
- 14 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article - Natural Resources 15

- 8-724. 16
- 17 If an accident involves any vessel subject to this subtitle while on the waters 18 of the State and results in the death, disappearance, or injury of any person or in property 19 damage of \$2,000 or more, or there is complete loss of the vessel, the operator shall file with 20 the Department a full description of the accident, including any information the 21 Department requires by regulation. If the operator is unable to file the report, the vessel owner shall file the report. If the accident caused the death or disappearance of any person

- 23 or a person receives medical treatment beyond first aid, the report shall be made within 48
- 24hours. Any other accident resulting in personal injury or property damage, INCLUDING

- 1 DAMAGE TO NAVIGATIONAL AID MARKERS, LIGHTS, OR IDENTIFIERS, shall be
- 2 reported within 10 days. This subsection does not apply to a vessel required to have a
- 3 certificate of inspection under Chapter 1, Title 46, Code of Federal Regulations.
- 4 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 5 October 1, 2025.
