the Department a full description of the accident, including any information the 1 $\mathbf{2}$ Department requires by regulation. If the operator is unable to file the report, the vessel 3 owner shall file the report. If the accident caused the death or disappearance of any person 4 or a person receives medical treatment beyond first aid, the report shall be made within 48 hours. Any other accident resulting in personal injury or property damage, INCLUDING $\mathbf{5}$ 6 DAMAGE TO NAVIGATIONAL AID MARKERS, LIGHTS, OR IDENTIFIERS, shall be 7 reported within 10 days. This subsection does not apply to a vessel required to have a 8 certificate of inspection under Chapter 1, Title 46, Code of Federal Regulations.

9 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 10 October 1, 2025.
