BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: **Article - Estates and Trusts** 14.5 - 705. A trustee may resign [with]: (a) **(1)** ON AT LEAST 30 DAYS' NOTICE TO: **(I)** THE QUALIFIED BENEFICIARIES;
