BY renumbering Article – General Provisions Section 7–416 through 7–421 to be Section 7–417 through 7–422, respectively Annotated Code of Maryland (2019 Replacement Volume and 2024 Supplement) BY adding to Article – General Provisions Section 7–416 Annotated Code of Maryland (2019 Replacement Volume and 2024 Supplement) Preamble WHEREAS, Drug addiction is a chronic disease, characterized by compulsive or difficult-to-control drug use despite harmful consequences; and WHEREAS, Drug addiction is seen by both the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and the World Health Organization as a fast-growing epidemic that can all too easily lead to overdose and death; and WHEREAS, For every drug overdose that results in death, there are many more nonfatal overdoses, each taking an emotional and economic toll on the individual, the

1	WHEREAS, Drug addiction can fuel feelings of shame, guilt, embarrassment,
2	depression, and hopelessness, causing individuals to resist seeking treatment and support;

- WHEREAS, Overdose Awareness Day is a global event held August 31 each year that aims to raise awareness of drug overdoses, reduce the stigma of a drug—related death, and acknowledge the grief felt by families and friends remembering those who have died or had a permanent injury as a result of a drug overdose; and
- WHEREAS, Recognizing Overdose Awareness Day in Maryland sends a strong message to former or current substance users, namely, that they are valued, and that overdose death is preventable; now, therefore,
- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That Section(s) 7–416 through 7–421 of Article – General Provisions of the Annotated Code of Maryland be renumbered to be Section(s) 7–417 through 7–422, respectively.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

16 Article - General Provisions

- 17 **7–416.**
- THE GOVERNOR ANNUALLY SHALL PROCLAIM AUGUST 31 AS OVERDOSE AWARENESS DAY.
- SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2025.
