Marriage - Confidential Communication

- FOR the purpose of clarifying that "spouse" includes a former spouse for purposes of disclosure of confidential communications occurring during marriage; establishing that a certain spouse is competent to disclose a certain confidential communication in a criminal action in which one spouse is charged with a crime against the other spouse; and generally relating to confidential communications occurring during marriage.

- 14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
- 15 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

16 Article - Courts and Judicial Proceedings

- 18 (A) IN THIS SECTION, "SPOUSE" INCLUDES A FORMER SPOUSE.
- 19 (B) [One] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (C) OF THIS SECTION, ONE spouse is not competent to disclose any confidential communication between the spouses occurring during their marriage.

EXPLANATION: CAPITALS INDICATE MATTER ADDED TO EXISTING LAW.

[Brackets] indicate matter deleted from existing law.



- 1 (C) (1) A SPOUSE WHO IS THE ALLEGED VICTIM IS COMPETENT TO 2 DISCLOSE A CONFIDENTIAL COMMUNICATION BETWEEN SPOUSES OCCURRING 3 DURING THEIR MARRIAGE IN A CRIMINAL ACTION IN WHICH ONE SPOUSE IS 4 CHARGED WITH A CRIME AGAINST THE OTHER SPOUSE.
- 5 (2) A SPOUSE MAY NOT BE COMPELLED TO TESTIFY TO A 6 CONFIDENTIAL COMMUNICATION UNDER THIS SUBSECTION.
- 7 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 8 October 1, 2025.
