BY repealing and reenacting, without amendments, Article – Public Safety Section 5-301(a) and (c) and 5-304(b)(1) and (d)(2) Annotated Code of Maryland (2022 Replacement Volume and 2024 Supplement) BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, Article – Public Safety Section 5-309 Annotated Code of Maryland (2022 Replacement Volume and 2024 Supplement) SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: Article - Public Safety

- 3 (c) "Permit" means a permit issued by the Secretary to carry, wear, or transport 4 a handgun.

- 6 (b) (1) Subject to subsections (c) and (d) of this section, the Secretary may 7 charge a nonrefundable fee payable when an application is filed for a permit.
- 8 (d) The Secretary may not charge a fee under subsection (b) of this section to:
- 9 (2) a retired law enforcement officer of the State or a county or municipal corporation of the State.

- 12 (a) Except as provided in [subsection] SUBSECTIONS (d) AND (E) of this section, 13 a permit expires on the last day of the holder's birth month following 2 years after the date 14 the permit is issued.

 16 AND SUBJECT to subsection (c) of this section, a permit may be renewed for successive
 17 periods of 3 years each if, at the time of an application for renewal, the applicant possesses
 18 the qualifications for the issuance of a permit and pays the renewal fee stated in this
 19 subtitle.
- 20 (c) A person who applies for a renewal of a permit is not required to be 21 fingerprinted unless the Secretary requires a set of the person's fingerprints to resolve a 22 question of the person's identity.
- 23 (d) The Secretary may establish an alternative expiration date for a permit to 24 coincide with the expiration of a license, certification, or commission for:
- 25 (1) a private detective under Title 13 of the Business Occupations and 26 Professions Article;
- 27 (2) a security guard under Title 19 of the Business Occupations and 28 Professions Article; or
- 29 (3) a special police officer under § 3–306 of this article.
- 30 **(E)** A PERMIT ISSUED TO A RETIRED LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER WHO 31 RETIRED IN GOOD STANDING FROM SERVICE WITH A LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY
