FOR the purpose of requiring the Motor Vehicle Administration to disqualify any individual
from driving a commercial motor vehicle for a certain period of time if the individual

11 (b) If any of the offenses in subsection (a) of this section occurred while 12 transporting a hazardous material required to be placarded, the Administration shall 13 disqualify the individual for a period of 3 years.

14 (c) The Administration shall disqualify any person from driving a commercial 15 motor vehicle for life for 2 or more violations of any of the offenses specified in subsection 16 (a) or (b) of this section, or any combination of those offenses, arising from 2 or more 17 separate incidents.

18 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 19 October 1, 2025.
