FOR the purpose of altering the membership of the Maryland Agricultural Commission;
establishing the Committee on Young Farmers for certain purposes, including to
communicate to the Maryland Agricultural Commission on certain matters relating
to young farmers in the State; repealing the provisions of law establishing and
governing the Young Farmers Advisory Board; and generally relating to the
Maryland Agricultural Commission and young farmers in the State.

6 (A) IN THIS SECTION, "COMMITTEE" MEANS THE COMMITTEE ON YOUNG 7 FARMERS.

8 (B) THERE IS A COMMITTEE ON YOUNG FARMERS.

9 (C) (1) THE COMMITTEE CONSISTS OF 10 MEMBERS DESIGNATED BY 10 THE SECRETARY IN CONSULTATION WITH THE EXECUTIVE SECRETARY OF THE 11 MARYLAND AGRICULTURAL COMMISSION.

12 (2) (I) EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBPARAGRAPH (II) OF THIS 13 PARAGRAPH, THE SECRETARY SHALL DESIGNATE THE MEMBERS OF THE 14 COMMITTEE ON AN ANNUAL BASIS.

20 (I) BE INTERESTED IN THE PRESERVATION AND 21 DEVELOPMENT OF MARYLAND AGRICULTURE;
