CHAPTER

1 AN ACT concerning

2 Election Law - Postelection Tabulation Audits - Risk-Limiting Audits

- 3 FOR the purpose of requiring the State Board of Elections, in collaboration with the local 4 boards of elections, to conduct a risk-limiting audit after each statewide election; 5 authorizing the State Board, in collaboration with the local boards, to conduct a 6 risk-limiting audit after a special general election; authorizing, rather than 7 requiring, the State Board, in collaboration with the local boards, to conduct an 8 automated software audit after a statewide election; authorizing a local board to 9 conduct a risk-limiting audit of a local contest under certain circumstances; 10 repealing a requirement to conduct a manual audit after each statewide general 11 election; and generally relating to postelection tabulation audits.

- 21 CHANCE THAT A RISK-LIMITING AUDIT WILL NOT REQUIRE A FULL MANUAL COUNT
- 22 OF VOTER-VERIFIABLE PAPER RECORDS IN AN AUDITED CONTEST IF A FULL
- 23 MANUAL COUNT OF THE VOTER-VERIFIABLE PAPER RECORDS WOULD FIND A
- 24 DIFFERENT OUTCOME THAN THE OUTCOME DETERMINED BY THE ELECTRONIC

- 26 (7) "RISK-LIMITING AUDIT" MEANS A POSTELECTION AUDIT
- 27 PROCEDURE THAT EMPLOYS STATISTICAL METHODS TO ENSURE A LARGE,
- 28 PREDETERMINED MINIMUM CHANCE OF REQUIRING A FULL MANUAL COUNT OF
- 29 VOTER-VERIFIABLE PAPER RECORDS IN AN AUDITED CONTEST IF A FULL MANUAL

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1 Within 14 days after the conclusion of the audit, the State Board shall 2 post on its website a report that describes: 3 the precincts and number of votes selected for the manual audit in each county and the manner in which the precincts and votes were selected; 4 5 the results of the manual audit; and (ii) 6 any discrepancy shown by the manual audit and how the (iii) 7 discrepancy was resolved. - 4 RECORDS UNTIL THE RISK LIMIT IS MET OR THE CORRECT ELECTION OUTCOME IS
- 5 ESTABLISHED;
- 6 (II) BE COMPLETED BEFORE CERTIFICATION OF THE ELECTION
- 7 RESULTS THE BOARD OF STATE CANVASSERS TRANSMITS A CERTIFIED STATEMENT
- 8 OF THE ELECTION RESULTS TO THE STATE BOARD UNDER § 11–503(A) OF THIS
- 9 TITLE; AND
- 10 (III) BE OBSERVABLE BY THE PUBLIC TO THE MAXIMUM EXTENT
- 11 PRACTICABLE.
- 12 (5) (I) IF A RISK-LIMITING AUDIT FINDS THAT THE ELECTION
- 13 OUTCOME DETERMINED BY THE ELECTRONIC COUNT IS INCORRECT, THE OFFICIAL
- 14 RESULT OF THE ELECTION SHALL BE ALTERED TO MATCH THE OUTCOME
- 15 DETERMINED BY THE-RISK-LIMITING AUDIT.
- 16 WITHIN 10 DAYS AFTER THE CONCLUSION OF THE RISK-LIMITING
- 17 AUDIT, THE STATE BOARD SHALL POST ON THE STATE BOARD'S WEBSITE A REPORT
- 18 THAT DESCRIBES THE AUDIT PROCESS AND THE RESULTS OF THE AUDIT
- 19 INACCURATE, THE STATE ADMINISTRATOR, IN CONSULTATION WITH THE STATE
- 20 BOARD, SHALL DIRECT THE RELEVANT BOARD OF CANVASSERS TO IMMEDIATELY
- 21 INVESTIGATE THE MATTER TO DETERMINE AN ACCURATE ELECTION RESULT.
- 22 (II) THE BOARD OF CANVASSERS SHALL CONCLUDE THE
- 23 INVESTIGATION WITHIN 3 DAYS.
- 24 (III) THE BOARD OF CANVASSERS SHALL CORRECT THE
- 25 ELECTION RESULT IN ACCORDANCE WITH REGULATIONS ADOPTED BY THE STATE
- 26 BOARD.
- 27 (6) THE STATE ADMINISTRATOR SHALL REPORT THE RESULTS OF
- 28 THE RISK-LIMITING AUDIT TO THE BOARD OF STATE CANVASSERS AND THE STATE
- 29 **BOARD.**
- 30 (C) IN ADDITION TO THE RISK-LIMITING AUDIT REQUIRED UNDER
- 31 SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION, THE STATE BOARD, IN COLLABORATION WITH
- 32 THE LOCAL BOARDS, MAY CONDUCT AN AUTOMATED SOFTWARE AUDIT AFTER A
- 33 STATEWIDE ELECTION.
