CHAPTER _____

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Baltimore City – Raffles – Organizations Affiliated With a Professional Major**
3 **League Baseball Team**

4 FOR the purpose of authorizing certain organizations that are affiliated with a professional
5 major league baseball team that plays its home games in Baltimore City to conduct
6 certain raffles; requiring the organization to obtain a permit to conduct raffles from
7 an agency designated by the Baltimore City government; requiring that raffle tickets
8 are sold using age-verification measures to ensure that the buyer is at least a certain
9 age; authorizing a raffle ticket to be sold and received in-person or on an electronic
10 device located within ~~the a certain~~ geographical boundaries of area in Baltimore City;
11 providing that, subject to certain limitations, an organization conducting a raffle
12 under this Act is not subject to a certain provision of law that prohibits the
13 organization from accepting credit as payment; and generally relating to raffles in
14 Baltimore City.

11 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
12 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

13 **Article – Criminal Law**

14 13–501.

15 (a) In this subtitle the following words have the meanings indicated.

16 (b) “Commissioner” means the Baltimore City Police Commissioner.

17 (c) **“DESIGNATED CITY AGENCY” MEANS AN AGENCY DESIGNATED BY THE**
18 **BALTIMORE CITY GOVERNMENT.**

19 (d) (1) **“ELECTRONIC DEVICE” MEANS A DEVICE THAT IS CAPABLE OF**
20 **TRANSMITTING, RECEIVING, OR RECORDING MESSAGES, IMAGES, SOUNDS, DATA, OR**
21 **OTHER INFORMATION BY ELECTRONIC MEANS OR THAT, IN APPEARANCE,**
22 **PURPORTS TO BE A CELL PHONE, COMPUTER, OR OTHER SUCH DEVICE.**

23 (2) **“ELECTRONIC DEVICE” INCLUDES A CELL PHONE OR COMPUTER.**

24 (3) **“ELECTRONIC DEVICE” DOES NOT INCLUDE A VIDEO LOTTERY**
25 **TERMINAL AS DEFINED UNDER § 9–1A–01 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE.**

26 [(c)] (e) “Gaming event” means a carnival, bazaar, or raffle.

27 (f) (1) **“GEOFENCE” MEANS TECHNOLOGY THAT ESTABLISHES A**
28 **VIRTUAL GEOGRAPHICAL BOUNDARY.**

29 (2) **“GEOFENCE” INCLUDES BOUNDARIES THAT ARE ESTABLISHED**
30 **OR MONITORED THROUGH THE USE OF:**

31 (i) **GLOBAL POSITIONING TECHNOLOGY;**

- 1 **(II) CELL TOWER CONNECTIVITY;**
 2 **(III) CELLULAR DATA;**
 3 **(IV) RADIO FREQUENCY IDENTIFICATION;**
 4 **(V) WIRELESS FIDELITY TECHNOLOGY; OR**
 5 **(VI) ANY OTHER FORM OF LOCATION DETERMINATION**
 6 **TECHNOLOGY.**

7 **[(d)] (G)** “Raffle” means one or more drawings from a single series of chances
 8 sold [from chance books].

9 13–503.

10 **(a) THIS SECTION DOES NOT APPLY TO A RAFFLE AUTHORIZED UNDER §**
 11 **13–505.1 OF THIS SUBTITLE.**

12 **(B)** Before an organization listed in subsection **[(b)] (C)** of this section may operate
 13 a gaming event, the organization shall obtain a permit from the commissioner.

14 **[(b)] (C)** (1) An organization that meets the conditions of paragraph (2) of this
 15 subsection may conduct a gaming event for the benefit of any of the following listed
 16 organizations if the organization is a bona fide:

- 17 (i) religious organization;
 18 (ii) fraternal organization;
 19 (iii) civic organization;
 20 (iv) veterans’ hospital;
 21 (v) amateur athletic organization in which all playing members are
 22 under the age of 18 years; or
 23 (vi) charitable organization.

24 (2) An organization conducting a gaming event shall:

- 25 (i) be located in Baltimore City; and
 26 (ii) spend a majority of the organization’s funds in Baltimore City
 27 for:

- 1 1. fraternal purposes;
- 2 2. civic purposes;
- 3 3. purposes related to a veterans' hospital;
- 4 4. purposes related to amateur athletics; or
- 5 5. charitable purposes.

6 **[(c)] (D)** (1) Before the commissioner may issue a permit, the commissioner
7 shall review the character of the organization applying for the permit to ascertain that the
8 organization meets the requirements of §§ 13–503 through 13–505 of this subtitle.

9 (2) The commissioner shall make any application for a permit and the
10 action taken by the commissioner on that application a matter of public record.

11 **[(d)] (E)** (1) The permit shall state that the gaming event shall be managed
12 and operated personally only by members of the organization obtaining the permit.

13 (2) The permit is not transferable.

14 **[(e)] (F)** An organization conducting a gaming event in Baltimore City may not
15 allow an individual or group of individuals to:

16 (1) benefit financially from the gaming event; or

17 (2) receive any of the proceeds of the gaming event for personal use or
18 benefit.

20 (a) A permit holder may award prizes in merchandise and money in a raffle in
21 any amount.

22 (b) **[A] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN § 13–505.1(D)(1)(II) OF THIS SUBTITLE, A**
23 permit holder may not conduct more than 12 raffles in a calendar year.

24 **13–505.1.**

25 **(A) A RAFFLE MAY BE CONDUCTED BY AN ORGANIZATION THAT:**

26 **(1) IS LOCATED IN BALTIMORE CITY;**

1 **(2) SPENDS A MAJORITY OF THE ORGANIZATION'S FUNDS IN**
2 **BALTIMORE CITY FOR:**

3 **(I) FRATERNAL PURPOSES;**

4 **(II) CIVIC PURPOSES;**

5 **(III) PURPOSES RELATED TO A VETERANS' HOSPITAL;**

6 **(IV) PURPOSES RELATED TO AMATEUR ATHLETICS; OR**

7 **(V) CHARITABLE PURPOSES; AND**

8 **(3) IS AFFILIATED WITH A PROFESSIONAL MAJOR LEAGUE BASEBALL**
9 **TEAM THAT PLAYS ITS HOME GAMES IN BALTIMORE CITY.**

10 **(B) (1) BEFORE CONDUCTING A RAFFLE, AN ORGANIZATION SHALL**
11 **OBTAIN A WRITTEN PERMIT FROM THE DESIGNATED CITY AGENCY.**

12 **(2) BEFORE ISSUING A PERMIT, THE DESIGNATED CITY AGENCY**
13 **SHALL ASCERTAIN THE CHARACTER OF THE ORGANIZATION TO DETERMINE IF THE**
14 **PERMIT SHOULD BE ISSUED.**

15 **(C) (1) A PERMIT ISSUED TO AN ORGANIZATION UNDER THIS SECTION**
16 **MAY NOT BE TRANSFERRED.**

17 **(2) THE PERMIT SHALL STATE THAT THE RAFFLE IS REQUIRED TO BE**
18 **MANAGED AND OPERATED ONLY BY MEMBERS OF THE ORGANIZATION OBTAINING**
19 **THE PERMIT.**

20 **(D) (1) (I) SUBJECT TO PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS SUBSECTION, THE**
21 **DESIGNATED CITY AGENCY MAY ISSUE A SINGLE PERMIT TO AN ORGANIZATION TO**
22 **HOLD RAFFLES AT MULTIPLE PROFESSIONAL MAJOR LEAGUE BASEBALL GAMES**
23 **PLAYED IN BALTIMORE CITY.**

24 **(II) THERE IS NO LIMIT ON THE NUMBER OF RAFFLES THAT AN**
25 **ORGANIZATION MAY CONDUCT IN CONJUNCTION WITH PROFESSIONAL MAJOR**
26 **LEAGUE BASEBALL GAMES PLAYED IN BALTIMORE CITY.**

27 **(2) A PERMIT TO HOLD RAFFLES AT MULTIPLE PROFESSIONAL**
28 **MAJOR LEAGUE BASEBALL GAMES PLAYED IN BALTIMORE CITY EXPIRES AT THE**
29 **END OF THE CALENDAR YEAR IN WHICH THE PERMIT IS ISSUED.**

30 **(E) AN ORGANIZATION CONDUCTING A RAFFLE MAY:**

1 (1) SET THE PRICE OF RAFFLE TICKETS; AND

2 (2) AWARD PRIZES IN MERCHANDISE AND MONEY IN ANY AMOUNT.

3 (F) AN ORGANIZATION CONDUCTING A RAFFLE MAY NOT ALLOW AN
4 INDIVIDUAL OR GROUP OF INDIVIDUALS TO:

5 (1) BENEFIT FINANCIALLY FROM THE RAFFLE; OR

6 (2) RECEIVE ANY OF THE PROCEEDS OF THE RAFFLE FOR PERSONAL
7 USE OR BENEFIT.

8 (G) (1) A RAFFLE TICKET SOLD BY AN ORGANIZATION IN CONJUNCTION
9 WITH A PROFESSIONAL MAJOR LEAGUE BASEBALL GAME PLAYED IN BALTIMORE
10 CITY:

11 (I) ~~SHALL~~ MAY ONLY BE SOLD USING ONLY AGE-VERIFICATION
12 MEASURES TO ENSURE THAT THE BUYER IS AT LEAST 18 YEARS OLD;

13 ~~(H)~~ (II) MAY BE SOLD AND RECEIVED IN-PERSON OR ON AN
14 ELECTRONIC DEVICE ONLY WITHIN THE GEOGRAPHICAL BOUNDARIES OF
15 BALTIMORE CITY DESCRIBED IN PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS SUBSECTION; AND

16 ~~(H)~~ (III) SHALL BE SOLD AND RECEIVED NOT EARLIER THAN 1
17 HOUR BEFORE THE OFFICIAL START OF THE BASEBALL GAME AND NOT LATER THAN
18 THE SEVENTH INNING OF THAT BASEBALL GAME.

19 (2) AN ORGANIZATION CONDUCTING A RAFFLE UNDER THIS SECTION:

20 (I) IS NOT SUBJECT TO § 12-108 OF THIS ARTICLE, PROVIDED
21 THAT AN INDIVIDUAL MAY NOT PURCHASE MORE THAN \$50 WORTH OF TICKETS OR
22 MAKE MORE THAN ONE CREDIT TRANSACTION EACH DAY; AND

23 (II) SHALL USE A GEOFENCE TO ENSURE THAT RAFFLE TICKETS
24 SOLD AND RECEIVED ON AN ELECTRONIC DEVICE ARE SOLD AND RECEIVED ~~WITHIN~~
25 ~~THE GEOGRAPHICAL BOUNDARIES OF~~ WITHIN AN AREA IN BALTIMORE CITY THAT IS
26 BOUNDED AS FOLLOWS: FROM THE INTERSECTION OF WEST CAMDEN STREET AND
27 SOUTH HOWARD STREET, SOUTH ON SOUTH HOWARD STREET TO WEST CONWAY
28 STREET, WEST ON WEST CONWAY STREET TO SOUTH EUTAW STREET, SOUTH ON
29 SOUTH EUTAW STREET TO WEST LEE STREET, WEST ON WEST LEE STREET TO
30 RUSSELL STREET, NORTH ON RUSSELL STREET TO SOUTH PACA STREET,
31 NORTHEAST ON SOUTH PACA STREET TO WEST CAMDEN STREET, AND EAST ON

1 WEST CAMDEN STREET TO THE INTERSECTION OF WEST CAMDEN STREET AND
2 SOUTH HOWARD STREET.

4 (a) A person may not knowingly conduct or attempt to conduct a bazaar or raffle
5 in violation of §§ 13-503 through 13-505 AND **13-505.1** of this subtitle.

6 (b) A person who violates this section is guilty of a misdemeanor and on conviction
7 is subject to imprisonment not exceeding 1 year or a fine not exceeding \$1,000 or both.

8 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect June
9 1, 2025. It shall remain effective for a period of ~~3 years~~ 1 year and 1 month and, at the end
10 of ~~May 31, 2028~~ June 30, 2026, this Act, with no further action required by the General
11 Assembly, shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
