AN ACT concerning
Motor Vehicles - Automated Enforcement Programs - Privacy Protections
FOR the purpose of requiring a custodian of recorded images produced by certain automated enforcement systems to deny inspection of the recorded images, subject to certain exceptions; prohibiting certain State and local agencies from using a recorded image or associated data produced by an automated enforcement system

without a warrant, subpoena, or court order unless the use is for an appropriate

traffic enforcement purpose; subject to certain exceptions; establishing certain

requirements and authorizations for the removal and destruction of recorded images

and associated data produced by an automated enforcement system; establishing certain prohibitions and requirements for privacy protection under automated

enforcement programs; and generally relating to privacy protections for automated


