- FOR the purpose of prohibiting a person, with the intent to conceal the death of another a crime, from failing to notify emergency medical services or law enforcement regarding the death, committing certain destructive acts to any part of human remains, or burying or otherwise disposing of a dead body; prohibiting a person from aiding or abetting another in committing a violation of this Act; and generally relating to the prohibition against the intentional concealment of a death crimes relating to human remains.
