2 Adult Education – High School Diploma by Examination – Requirements and Study

- FOR the purpose of requiring the Maryland Department of Labor to allow an individual to take all components of the General Educational Development Test in the <u>same</u> language of their choice; requiring the Department to submit a certain report to certain committees of the General Assembly on or before a certain date; and generally relating to examination requirements for a high school diploma by examination.
