SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That: The State Retirement Agency shall convene a workgroup of interested stakeholders to study the requirements and processes for transfers of member service between State and local retirement and pension systems and make recommendations to improve the process of transfers between systems. (2)The workgroup convened under paragraph (1) of this subsection shall include: (i) one or more representatives of the State Retirement Agency, designated by the Executive Director of the State Retirement Agency; (ii) 1. one representative of the Baltimore City Employees' Retirement System or the Baltimore City Fire and Police Employees' Retirement System;
