FOR the purpose of renaming the Maryland Water Quality Revolving Loan Fund to be the Maryland Water Quality Improvement Revolving Loan Fund; altering the conditions under which the Fund may be used to include supporting certain projects; requiring the Maryland Water Infrastructure Financing Administration to include certain communities and to use a certain scoring system when creating a certain intended use plan; and generally relating to the Maryland Water Quality Improvement Revolving Loan Fund.

- 9 the best management practices set forth for implementation within a financial assistance 10 application.
  - 11 (c) On or before October 1, 2003, the Department shall issue guidelines to public 12 water systems on best management practices for improving water conservation and 13 efficiency in water use, treatment, storage, and transmission, including:
  - 14 (1) Costs and cost-savings associated with implementing examples of specific best management practices;
