- 15 (a) With respect to any State program of benefits, rights, or privileges applicable 16 to a veteran under this Code, "honorable discharge" includes discharge that is less than 17 honorable:
- 18 (1) solely due to the sexual orientation or gender identity of the individual 19 being discharged; [or]
- 20 (2) based on a statement or consensual act of the individual being discharged related to the individual's sexual orientation or gender identity, if the statement or consensual act was prohibited by the military or naval service at the time of discharge;
