- 9 (c) In conducting the study required under subsection (a) of this section, the 10 Department shall consult with local officials and stakeholders that have expertise and 11 familiarity with traffic safety issues faced by drivers who use highways in the State that 12 connect to I–495.
- 13 (d) On or before December 31, 2025, the Department shall report its findings and 14 recommendations to the Governor and, in accordance with § 2–1257 of the State 15 Government Article, the General Assembly.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2025. It shall remain effective for a period of 1 year and, at the end of June 30, 2026, this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
