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20 (a) In this subtitle the following terms have the meanings indicated unless the 21 context of their use requires otherwise.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,

(f) (1) "Health care provider" means a hospital, a related institution as defined in § 19–301 of the Health – General Article, a medical day care center, a hospice care program, an assisted living program, a freestanding ambulatory care facility as defined in



- § 19–3B–01 of the Health General Article, a physician, a physician assistant, an osteopath, an optometrist, a chiropractor, a registered or licensed practical nurse, a dentist, a podiatrist, a psychologist, a licensed certified social worker–clinical, **AN EMPLOYEE**,
- 4 AGENT, OR CONTRACTOR OF A HOSPITAL WHO IS LICENSED, CERTIFIED,
- 5 $\,$ REGISTERED, OR OTHERWISE AUTHORIZED TO RENDER HEALTH CARE SERVICES IN
- 6 MARYLAND, and a physical therapist, licensed or authorized to provide one or more health
- 7 care services in Maryland.
- 8 (2) "Health care provider" does not include any nursing institution 9 conducted by and for those who rely upon treatment by spiritual means through prayer 10 alone in accordance with the tenets and practices of a recognized church or religious 11 denomination.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 13 October 1, 2025.
