## Article - Alcoholic Beverages and Cannabis

- 4 (a) There is a barbershop beer and wine license.
- 5 (b) The Board may issue the license to a holder of a barbershop permit under § 6 4–501 of the Business Occupations and Professions Article.
- 7 (c) The license authorizes the license holder to provide no more than [5] **6.5** 8 ounces of wine by the glass or 12 ounces of beer for on–premises consumption by a barbershop customer:
- 10 (1) when the customer is provided a service described in § 4–101(l) of the 11 Business Occupations and Professions Article; or
- 12 (2) while the customer is attending a fund-raising event at the barbershop for which the Department of Permits and Inspections, if required, has issued a permit.
- 14 (d) The license may not be transferred to another location.
- 15 (e) The license holder may provide beer and wine for on-premises consumption during normal business hours but not later than 9 p.m.
- 17 (f) The annual license fee is \$100.
- 18 20–1002.
- 19 (a) There is a beauty salon beer and wine license.
- 20 (b) The Board may issue the license to a holder of a beauty salon permit under § 21 5–501 of the Business Occupations and Professions Article.
- 22 (c) The license authorizes the license holder to provide no more than [5] **6.5** 23 ounces of wine by the glass or 12 ounces of beer for on–premises consumption by a beauty 24 salon customer:
- 25 (1) when the customer is provided a cosmetology service described in § 26 5–101(n)(1) of the Business Occupations and Professions Article; or
- 27 (2) while the customer is attending a fund–raising event at the beauty salon for which the Department of Permits and Inspections, if required, has issued a permit.
- 29 (d) The license may not be transferred to another location.

The license holder may provide beer and wine for on-premises consumption
