A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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Public Health - Opioid Overdose Reversal Drugs

- FOR the purpose of requiring a licensed health care provider, when issuing a standing order for an opioid overdose reversal drug, to allow an individual to choose any formulation of any opioid overdose reversal drug approved by the federal Food and Drug Administration; prohibiting certain private and public entities that prescribe and dispense opioid overdose reversal drugs from being required to keep in stock or dispense all opioid overdose reversal drugs approved by the federal Food and Drug Administration; and generally relating to opioid overdose reversal drugs.

- 25 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND.
- 26 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

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Article - Health - General

- 2 13-3101.
- 3 (a) In this subtitle the following words have the meanings indicated.
- 4 (c) "Private or public entity" means a health care provider, local health 5 department, community—based organization, substance abuse treatment organization, or 6 other person that addresses medical or social issues related to drug addiction.
- 7 (e) "Standing order" means a written instruction for the prescribing and 8 dispensing of an opioid overdose reversal drug approved by the federal Food and Drug 9 Administration in accordance with § 13–3106 of this subtitle.
- 10 13–3104.
- An authorized private or public entity shall enter into a written agreement with a licensed health care provider with prescribing authority to establish protocols for the prescribing and dispensing of an opioid overdose reversal drug approved by the federal Food and Drug Administration to any individual in accordance with this subtitle.
- 15 13–3106.
- 16 (a) A licensed health care provider with prescribing authority may prescribe and 17 dispense an opioid overdose reversal drug approved by the federal Food and Drug 18 Administration to an individual who:
- 19 (1) Is believed by the licensed health care provider to be at risk of 20 experiencing an opioid overdose; or
- 21 (2) Is in a position to assist an individual at risk of experiencing an opioid 22 overdose.
- 23 (b) (1) A licensed health care provider with prescribing authority may 24 prescribe and dispense opioid overdose reversal drugs approved by the federal Food and 25 Drug Administration by issuing a standing order if the licensed health care provider:
- 26 (i) Is employed by the Department or a local health department; or
- 27 (ii) Has a written agreement with an authorized private or public 28 entity under § 13–3104 of this subtitle.
- 29 (2) When issuing a standing order for an opioid overdose 30 Reversal drug under paragraph (1) of this subsection, a licensed health 31 Care provider shall allow the individual to choose any formulation of 32 Any opioid overdose reversal drug approved by the federal Food and 33 Drug Administration.

- [(2)] (3) A licensed health care provider with prescribing authority who issues a standing order under paragraph (1) of this subsection may delegate the dispensing of opioid overdose reversal drugs approved by the federal Food and Drug Administration to an employee or a volunteer of an authorized private or public entity in accordance with a written agreement under § 13–3104 of this subtitle.
- [(3)] (4) Any licensed health care provider who has dispensing authority also may dispense an opioid overdose reversal drug approved by the federal Food and Drug Administration to any individual in accordance with a standing order issued by a licensed health care provider with prescribing authority in accordance with this subsection.
- 10 (c) A pharmacist may dispense opioid overdose reversal drugs approved by the 11 federal Food and Drug Administration in accordance with a therapy management contract 12 under Title 12, Subtitle 6A of the Health Occupations Article.

- AN AUTHORIZED PRIVATE OR PUBLIC ENTITY THAT PRESCRIBES AND DISPENSES OPIOID OVERDOSE REVERSAL DRUGS MAY NOT BE REQUIRED TO KEEP IN STOCK OR DISPENSE ALL OPIOID OVERDOSE REVERSAL DRUGS APPROVED BY THE FEDERAL FOOD AND DRUG ADMINISTRATION.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2025.
