CHAPTER _____

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Garrett County Alcoholic Beverages Act of 2025**

3 FOR the purpose of establishing certain deluxe complex restaurant and resort complex beer
4 and wine and beer, wine, and liquor licenses in Garrett County; requiring the Board
5 of License Commissioners for Garrett County to hold a hearing for the issuance of
6 certain festival licenses and altering certain notice requirements for the hearing;
7 requiring certain festival license applicants to apply to the Board in a certain
8 manner; clarifying the entities to which the Board may issue certain multiple day
9 and multiple event licenses; and generally relating to alcoholic beverages in Garrett
10 County.

4 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
5 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

8 This title applies only in Garrett County.

10 **(A) THERE IS A CLASS BDR–DC (DELUXE COMPLEX RESTAURANT) BEER**
11 **AND WINE LICENSE.**

12 **(B) THE LICENSE MAY BE ISSUED TO A HOLDER OF:**

13 **(1) ANY CLASS B ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES LICENSE ISSUED BY THE**
14 **BOARD; OR**

15 **(2) AN EQUIVALENT LICENSE THAT THE LOCAL LICENSING BOARD OF**
16 **A DIFFERENT JURISDICTION ISSUES ONLY FOR USE BY A RESTAURANT.**

17 **(C) (1) THE BOARD MAY ISSUE THE LICENSE FOR USE BY A DELUXE**

21 **RESTAURANT FACILITIES, NOT INCLUDING THE COST OF LAND OR BUILDINGS.**

22 **(2) IF THE APPLICANT PURCHASES OR LEASES AN EXISTING**
23 **BUILDING, THE CAPITAL INVESTMENT ATTRIBUTABLE TO THE COST OF THE LAND**
24 **AND IMPROVEMENTS SHALL BE BASED ON THE ASSESSED VALUE OF THE LAND AND**
25 **IMPROVEMENTS IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE RECORDS OF THE STATE DEPARTMENT**
26 **OF ASSESSMENTS AND TAXATION AT THE TIME OF PURCHASE.**

27 **(3) THE LICENSE AUTHORIZES THE LICENSE HOLDER TO SELL, AT**
28 **RETAIL, AT THE PLACE DESCRIBED IN THE LICENSE:**

29 **(I) BEER AND WINE FOR ON–PREMISES CONSUMPTION; AND**

1 (II) BEER FOR OFF-PREMISES CONSUMPTION.

2 (D) (1) THE BOARD MAY ISSUE THE LICENSE WITH A CATERING OPTION.

3 (2) IN ADDITION TO EXERCISING THE PRIVILEGES STATED IN
4 SUBSECTION (C)(3) OF THIS SECTION, A HOLDER OF A LICENSE WITH A CATERING
5 OPTION MAY SELL BEER AND WINE FOR CONSUMPTION AT EVENTS THAT THE
6 LICENSE HOLDER CATERS OFF THE LICENSED PREMISES.

7 (3) TO EXERCISE THE CATERING OPTION, THE LICENSE HOLDER
8 SHALL PROVIDE FOOD AT THE CATERED EVENT.

9 (4) THE LICENSE HOLDER MAY EXERCISE THE CATERING OPTION
10 ONLY DURING THE HOURS AND DAYS THAT THE BOARD ALLOWS.

11 (E) THE ANNUAL LICENSE FEES ARE:

12 (1) \$500 FOR A 6-DAY LICENSE WITHOUT A CATERING OPTION;

13 (2) \$625 FOR A 6-DAY LICENSE WITH A CATERING OPTION;

14 (3) \$585 FOR A 7-DAY LICENSE WITHOUT A CATERING OPTION; AND

15 (4) \$710 FOR A 7-DAY LICENSE WITH A CATERING OPTION.

16 (F) THE BOARD SHALL:

17 (1) CHARGE A ONE-TIME ISSUING FEE FOR A NEW LICENSE IN AN
18 AMOUNT EQUAL TO THE ANNUAL LICENSE FEE; AND

19 (2) ADOPT REGULATIONS TO CARRY OUT THIS SECTION.

24 **CATERED EVENT OFF THE LICENSED PREMISES SHALL ALSO PROVIDE FOOD.**

25 **(3) THE LICENSE HOLDER MAY EXERCISE CATERING PRIVILEGES**
26 **ONLY DURING HOURS AND DAYS THAT ARE AUTHORIZED UNDER THE CLASS B**
27 **LICENSE.**

28 **(E) THE ANNUAL LICENSE FEES ARE:**

29 **(1) \$2,250 FOR A 6-DAY LICENSE WITHOUT A CATERING OPTION;**

30 **(2) \$2,750 FOR A 6-DAY LICENSE WITH A CATERING OPTION;**

1 **(3) \$2,625 FOR A 7-DAY LICENSE WITHOUT A CATERING OPTION; AND**

2 **(4) \$3,125 FOR A 7-DAY LICENSE WITH A CATERING OPTION.**

3 **(F) THE BOARD SHALL:**

4 **(1) CHARGE A ONE-TIME ISSUING FEE FOR A NEW LICENSE IN AN**

10 **COMPLEX THAT HAS AT LEAST TWO FACILITIES THAT ARE:**

11 **(1) LOCATED ON THE SAME CONTIGUOUS PROPERTY;**

12 **(2) SEPARATED BY AT LEAST 150 FEET FROM THE MAIN AREA OF THE**
13 **LICENSED PREMISES; AND**

14 **(3) DETERMINED BY THE BOARD TO BE HOTEL, MOTEL,**
15 **RECREATIONAL, OR RESTAURANT FACILITIES.**

23 **OF THIS TITLE.**

24 **(E) THE ANNUAL LICENSE FEES ARE:**

25 **(1) \$700 FOR A 6-DAY LICENSE FOR TWO FACILITIES;**

1 **(2) \$350 FOR EACH ADDITIONAL FACILITY FOR A 6-DAY LICENSE;**

2 **(3) \$820 FOR A 7-DAY LICENSE FOR TWO FACILITIES; AND**

3 **(4) \$410 FOR EACH ADDITIONAL FACILITY FOR A 7-DAY LICENSE.**

4 **(F) THE BOARD SHALL:**

5 **(1) CHARGE A ONE-TIME ISSUING FEE FOR A NEW LICENSE IN AN**
6 **AMOUNT EQUAL TO THE ANNUAL LICENSE FEE; AND**

7 **(2) ADOPT REGULATIONS TO CARRY OUT THIS SECTION.**

12 **COMPLEX THAT HAS AT LEAST TWO FACILITIES THAT ARE:**

3 **(3) \$3,500 FOR A 7-DAY LICENSE FOR TWO FACILITIES; AND**
4 **(4) \$1,750 FOR EACH ADDITIONAL FACILITY FOR A 7-DAY LICENSE.**

5 **(F) THE BOARD SHALL:**

- 6 **(1) CHARGE A ONE-TIME ISSUING FEE FOR A NEW LICENSE IN AN**
7 **AMOUNT EQUAL TO THE ANNUAL LICENSE FEE; AND**

- 10 (a) (1) There is a beer festival license.
11 (2) The Board may issue not more than four beer festival licenses each
12 year.

13 **(3) AN APPLICANT FOR THE LICENSE SHALL SUBMIT AN APPLICATION**
14 **ON THE FORM THAT THE BOARD PROVIDES.**

15 (b) The Board may issue the license to a holder of:

- 16 (1) a retail license issued by the Board;
17 (2) a Class 5 brewery license;
18 (3) a Class 6 pub-brewery license;
19 (4) a Class 7 micro-brewery license;
20 (5) a Class 8 farm brewery license; or
21 (6) a person that is eligible to hold a Class C multiple day or multiple event

- 4 (e) The Board shall [choose]:
- 5 (1) **HOLD A HEARING ON A LICENSE APPLICATION;**
- 6 **(2) PUBLISH NOTICE OF THE LICENSE APPLICATION HEARING ONE**
- 7 **TIME AT LEAST 7 DAYS BEFORE THE HEARING;**
- 8 **(3) CHOOSE** a fixed period of time for the festival of up to 3 consecutive
- 9 days, excluding Sunday; and
- 10 **[(2)] (4) CHOOSE** a location that is not already licensed.
- 11 (f) Notwithstanding subsection (e)(1) of this section, a holder of a beer festival
- 12 license issued for a location at which Sunday sales are allowed under § 21-2002(e) of this

- 27 (i) A person may hold a beer festival license in addition to another license.
- 28 (j) The Board shall set the fee.
- 29 (k) The Board shall adopt regulations to carry out this section.

2 (a) There is a Class C beer and wine street festival license.

3 (b) The Board may issue the license to a person that is eligible to hold a Class C
4 multiple day or multiple event license.

5 (c) The license authorizes the holder to sell beer and wine for on-premises
6 consumption at an entertainment event that is:

7 (1) held in an arts and entertainment district; and

8 (2) if required, approved by the mayor and town council of the municipality
9 where the event is located.

10 (d) During an event for which the license is issued, an individual in the event area
11 approved by the Board who uses a designated container unique to the event may:

12 (1) purchase beer or wine from:

13 (i) the holder of the beer and wine street festival license; or

14 (ii) another license holder with on-sale privileges within the arts
15 and entertainment district;

16 (2) transport beer or wine in the designated container:

17 (i) to the premises of a license holder with on-sale privileges in the
18 arts and entertainment district; and

19 (ii) in the approved event area; and

20 (3) consume beer and wine:

21 (i) on the premises of a license holder with on-sale privileges in the
22 arts and entertainment district; and

23 (ii) in the approved event area.

24 (e) An applicant for the license shall submit an application on the form that the
25 Board provides.

26 (f) The Board shall:

27 **(1) HOLD A HEARING ON A LICENSE APPLICATION; AND**

1 **(2)** publish [a notice for applications for the license] **NOTICE OF THE**
2 **LICENSE APPLICATION HEARING** one time at least 7 days before [a license] **THE** hearing.

3 (g) A license holder may purchase beer and wine from a holder of a retail or
4 wholesaler's license.

5 (h) The license holder:

6 (1) shall distribute a wristband to each individual who is at least 21 years
7 old at the event for which the license is issued; and

8 (2) may not serve beer or wine to an individual who does not wear a
9 wristband.

10 (i) The organization for which the license is issued shall ensure that at least one
11 server who is certified by an approved alcohol awareness program is on the premises when
12 alcoholic beverages are served.

13 (j) The license holder may hold another license of a different class or nature.

14 (k) The license may be used for a maximum of 26 days in a calendar year.

15 (l) The license fee is \$50 per day.

16 **(M) THE BOARD SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS TO CARRY OUT THIS SECTION.**

18 (a) (1) In this section the following words have the meanings indicated.

19 (2) "Festival" means the Garrett County Beer and Wine Festival.

20 (3) "Festival organization" means a nonprofit organization that is chosen
21 by the county in accordance with subsection (c) of this section to organize a festival.

22 (b) (1) There is a Garrett County Beer and Wine Festival.

23 (2) Under the supervision of the Board, the festival organization may
24 conduct the Festival annually for a fixed period of time of up to 3 consecutive days.

25 (c) (1) In selecting a nonprofit organization to be a festival organization, the
26 county shall ensure that the nonprofit organization has extensive experience in organizing
27 and managing large-scale public events.

28 (2) The Board may issue not more than four beer and wine festival licenses
29 each year.

1 (d) The Board may issue the license to a holder of a retail license or a person that
2 is eligible to hold a Class C multiple day or multiple event license.

3 (e) **AN APPLICANT FOR THE LICENSE SHALL SUBMIT AN APPLICATION ON**
4 **THE FORM THAT THE BOARD PROVIDES.**

5 **(F)** The license authorizes the holder to display and sell beer and wine that is:

6 (1) manufactured and processed in or outside the State; and

7 (2) distributed in the State when the license application is filed.

8 **[(f)] (G)** A license holder shall display and sell beer and wine:

9 (1) at retail for on- and off-premises consumption; and

10 (2) during the hours and days designated for the beer and wine festival.

11 **[(g)] (H)** The Board shall:

12 (1) hold a hearing on a license application; and

13 (2) publish notice of **[a] THE** license application hearing **[in a newspaper**
14 **of general circulation in the county]** one time at least 7 days before the hearing.

15 **[(h)] (I)** (1) The Board shall choose a location for the festival that is not
16 already licensed.

17 (2) If the location chosen allows for Sunday sales, Sunday sales may begin
18 at 10 a.m.

19 **[(i)] (J)** Beer and wine displayed and sold shall be:

20 (1) invoiced to the license holder by a retailer or wholesaler; and

21 (2) delivered to the festival from the licensed premises of the retailer or
22 wholesaler.

23 **[(j)] (K)** A holder of a retail license or State wholesaler's license may enter into
24 an agreement with the holder of the festival license to:

25 (1) deliver beer and wine not earlier than 2 days before the effective date
26 of the license; and

27 (2) accept returns not later than 5 days after the expiration date of the
28 license.

1 [(k)] (L) The Board shall establish the license fee.

2 [(l)] (M) The Board shall adopt regulations to carry out this section.

4 (a) (1) In this section the following words have the meanings indicated.

5 (2) “Festival” means the Garrett County Beer, Wine, and Liquor Festival.

6 (3) “Festival organization” means a nonprofit organization that is chosen
7 by the county in accordance with subsection (c) of this section to organize a festival.

8 (b) (1) There is a beer, wine, and liquor festival license.

9 (2) Under the supervision of the Board, the festival organization may

13 agreement with the holder of the beer, wine, and liquor festival license to:

14 (1) deliver beer, wine, and liquor not earlier than 2 days before the effective
15 date of the license; and

16 (2) accept returns not later than 5 days after the expiration date of the
17 license.

18 (k) The Board shall establish the beer, wine, and liquor festival license fee.

19 (l) The Board shall adopt regulations to carry out this section.

20 21-1305.

21 (a) (1) There is a wine festival license.

22 (2) The Board may issue not more than four wine festival licenses each
23 year.

24 **(3) AN APPLICANT FOR THE LICENSE SHALL SUBMIT AN APPLICATION**
25 **ON THE FORM THAT THE BOARD PROVIDES.**

26 (b) The Board may issue the license to:

27 (1) a holder of a retail license, Class 3 winery license, or Class 4 limited
28 winery license; or

1 (2) a person that is eligible to hold a Class C multiple day or multiple event
2 license.

3 (c) The license authorizes the holder to display and sell wine that is:

4 (1) manufactured and processed in any state; and

5 (2) distributed in the State when the license application is filed.

6 (d) A license holder shall display and sell wine:

7 (1) at retail for on- and off-premises consumption; and

8 (2) during the hours and days designated for the wine festival.

9 (e) The Board shall:

10 (1) hold a hearing on each license application; and

11 (2) publish notice of [a] **THE** license application hearing [in a newspaper
12 of general circulation in the county] one time at least 7 days before the hearing.

13 (f) (1) Subject to paragraph (3) of this subsection, each year the Board shall
14 choose up to 3 consecutive days for the wine festival.

15 (2) The Board shall choose a location that is not already licensed.

16 (3) A day chosen for the wine festival may not:

17 (i) be a Sunday; or

18 (ii) fall on the same weekend as the Maryland Wine Festival in
19 Carroll County.

20 (g) Notwithstanding subsection (f)(3)(i) of this section, a holder of a wine festival
21 license issued for use in a location where Sunday sales are allowed may make Sunday sales
22 beginning at 10 a.m.

23 (h) Wine displayed and sold shall be:

24 (1) invoiced to the license holder by a wholesaler, Class 3 winery, or Class
25 4 limited winery; and

26 (2) delivered to the wine festival from the licensed premises of the
27 wholesaler, Class 3 winery, or Class 4 limited winery.

1 (i) A holder of a State wholesale, Class 3 winery, or Class 4 limited winery license
2 may enter into an agreement with the license holder to:

3 (1) deliver wine not earlier than 2 days before the effective date of the
4 license; and

5 (2) accept returns not later than 5 days after the expiration date of the
6 license.

7 (j) The Board shall establish the license fee.

8 (k) The Board shall adopt regulations to carry out this section.

9 21–1309.

10 (a) The Board may issue a Class C multiple day beer license, beer and wine
11 license, and beer, wine, and liquor license to a [club] **NONPROFIT ORGANIZATION** for the
12 following fees and license types:

13 (1) \$50 for a 2–day license;

14 (2) \$150 for a 6–day license; and

15 (3) \$300 for a 12–day license.

16 (b) The license holder may hold another license issued by the Board that is of a
17 different class or nature.

18 (c) The Board is not required to hold a hearing before issuing a license under this
19 section if a license holder anticipates attendance of fewer than 500 individuals at an event.

20 21–1310.

21 (a) The Board may issue a multiple event license to a [club] **NONPROFIT**
22 **ORGANIZATION** that qualifies for a Class C multiple day license.

23 (b) The Board may not issue more than one multiple event license to a [club]
24 **NONPROFIT ORGANIZATION** in a license year.

25 (c) The license holder may hold another license issued by the Board that is of a
26 different class or nature.

27 (d) (1) The Board shall publish a notice for application for the license one time
28 at least 7 days before a license hearing.

29 (2) A license holder shall notify the Board in writing at least 7 days before
30 an event for which the license is to be used.

1 (e) The [club] **NONPROFIT ORGANIZATION** for which a multiple event license is
2 issued shall ensure that at least one server who is certified by an approved alcohol
3 awareness program is on the premises when alcoholic beverages are served.

4 (f) The [club] **NONPROFIT ORGANIZATION** for which a multiple event license is
5 issued may cater functions on their premises.

6 (g) The fee for a Class C multiple event license is:

7 (1) \$125 for not more than 5 events per year;

8 (2) \$250 for not more than 12 events per year;

9 (3) \$375 for not more than 18 events per year; and

10 (4) \$500 for not more than 24 events per year.

11 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July
12 1, 2025.
