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Public Schools – Individuals With Disabilities – Main Entrance Accessibility and Emergency Planning

FOR the purpose of requiring each county board of education to publish on its website and 4 5 report to the General Assembly on the number of main entrances to public school 6 buildings in the county that are not accessible for individuals with disabilities and 7 not in compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act; requiring each local 8 school system to send a copy of the local school system's emergency plan to the State 9 Department of Education; requiring the Department to report certain information to the General Assembly on or before a certain date each year; and generally relating 10 11 to school building main entrance accessibility and emergency planning for 12 individuals with disabilities.

- 14 Disabilities Act.

- school system's emergency plan to comply with the update of the Department's guidelines

- 33 in an emergency, the student's 504 team shall discuss and address the student's needs as
- 34 necessary.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 2 $\,$ 1, 2025.
