

18 19	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
20	Article – Economic Development

22	(a) There is a Western Maryland Economic Future Investment Board.
23	(b) The Board consists of the following members:



- 1 **[**(1) one representative from the Department of Commerce, appointed by the 2 Secretary of Commerce, who shall serve as a nonvoting member;
- 3 (2) one representative of an economic development organization in each 4 member county, appointed by each member county's respective commissioners, who shall 5 serve as a nonvoting member;
- 6 (3) one representative from District 1, appointed by the Speaker of the House, in consultation with the District 1 delegation to the Maryland General Assembly;
- 8 (4) one representative from District 2, appointed by the President of the 9 Senate, in consultation with the District 2 delegation to the Maryland General Assembly;
- 10 (5) one county commissioner from each member county;
- 11 (6) one representative from District 1, appointed by the President of the Senate, in consultation with the District 1 delegation to the Maryland General Assembly,
- 13 who shall serve as a nonvoting member;
- 14 (7) one representative from District 2, in consultation with the District 2 15 delegation to the Maryland General Assembly, appointed by the Speaker of the House, who 16 shall serve as a nonvoting member;
- 17 (8) the State Senator representing District 1, who shall serve as an ex 18 officio nonvoting member;
- 19 (9) the State Senator representing District 2, who shall serve as an ex 20 officio nonvoting member;
- 21 (10) a member of the House of Delegates representing a subdistrict in 22 District 1, appointed by the Speaker of the House, who shall serve as an ex officio nonvoting 23 member; and
- 24 (11) a member of the House of Delegates representing a subdistrict in 25 District 2, appointed by the Speaker of the House, who shall serve as an ex officio nonvoting 26 member]
- 27 (1) ONE REPRESENTATIVE FROM DISTRICT 1, APPOINTED BY THE 28 SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE, IN CONSULTATION WITH THE DISTRICT 1 DELEGATION TO 29 THE MARYLAND GENERAL ASSEMBLY;
- 30 (2) ONE REPRESENTATIVE FROM DISTRICT 1, APPOINTED BY THE 31 PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE, IN CONSULTATION WITH THE DISTRICT 1 DELEGATION 32 TO THE MARYLAND GENERAL ASSEMBLY;

1 interest or other income earned on the investment of money in (ii) 2 the Fund; and 3 (iii) any other money accepted for the benefit of the Fund. 4 In each of fiscal years 2024 through [2026] 2031, the Governor shall include in the annual operating or capital budget bill an appropriation of at least 5 \$10,000,000 to the Fund. 6 7 Money in the Fund may be used only to: (e) 8 (1)award grants and provide loans [to capital infrastructure projects and 9 business development projects to improve the economic conditions in the region IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 13–740 OF THIS SUBTITLE; and 10 11 pay the costs necessary to administer the Fund, including paying the (2)12 salary of the Executive Director. 13 The Fund is a special, nonlapsing fund that is not subject to reversion (1)14 under § 7–302 of the State Finance and Procurement Article. 15 The State Treasurer shall hold the Fund separately, and the (2)16 Comptroller shall account for the Fund. 17 The State Treasurer shall invest the money in the Fund in the same 18 manner as other State money may be invested. 19 **(4)** Any investment earnings of the Fund shall be credited to the Fund. 13 - 740.20 21A member county or local entity within a member county may submit a 22proposal for funding under this part. 23 (b) To qualify for funding, a project shall be: 24 (1)a capital infrastructure project that: 25(i) is linked to economic development in the region, as approved by 26 the Board: and 27 receives 20% matching funds from the member county where the 28project is located, another local entity, a private business, or a combination thereof; 29 **(2)** a business development project that:

- 1 encourages and promotes downtown neighborhood (i) 2 revitalization, small business tourism, or other areas as approved by the Board; and 3 receives 10% matching funds from the member county where the project is located, another local entity, a private business, or a combination thereof; or 4 5 any other project that the Board determines is appropriate to promote 6 economic development in the region. 7 (1) The Board shall develop criteria to review, evaluate, and rate (c) project proposals for funding under this part. 8 9 The criteria in subparagraph (i) of this paragraph shall ensure (ii) 10 that the project: 11 1. **PROVIDED** IN 2 **EXCEPT** \mathbf{AS} **ITEM** OF **THIS** 12 SUBPARAGRAPH, creates or retains AT LEAST 25 jobs; 13 2. creates or retains [businesses] AT LEAST 10 JOBS EACH WITH WAGES THAT MEET OR EXCEED 150% OF THE MEDIAN HOUSEHOLD INCOME 14 15 FOR THE MEMBER COUNTY IN WHICH THE PROJECT IS LOCATED, AS DETERMINED 16 BY THE MOST RECENT AVAILABLE DATA FROM THE STATE; OR 17 3. increases wages; or 18 4.1 creates [new State or local tax revenue] SIGNIFICANT 19 POPULATION GROWTH IN THE COUNTY OR MUNICIPALITY IN WHICH THE PROJECT IS 20 LOCATED, AS CERTIFIED IN WRITING TO THE BOARD BY THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS FOR THE MEMBER COUNTY OR THE MUNICIPAL GOVERNMENT FOR 2122 THE MUNICIPALITY IN WHICH THE PROJECT IS LOCATED. 23(2)The Board shall choose which projects to award grants and loans (i) to based on the criteria developed in accordance with paragraph (1) of this subsection. 2425The Board or the Executive Director shall distribute grants and (ii) 26 loans to projects based on the decisions made by the Board in accordance with 27 subparagraph (i) of this paragraph.
- 28 (d) (1) The Board or the Executive Director shall monitor and track the 29 progress of each project that receives funding under this part.
- 30 (2) If the Board determines that sufficient progress is not being made 31 toward achieving the requirements of this section, the Board may reclaim the awarded 32 funds.

- 1 (e) The funding provided in this section shall be used to supplement and not supplant any funds that would otherwise be provided to the Board or the member counties.
- 3 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 4 $\,$ 1, 2025.
