17 18	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND. That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
19	Article – Education
20	4–201.
21	(a) (1) This section does not apply to Baltimore City.
22 23	(2) Subsections (b), (c), (d), and (f) of this section do not apply in Prince George's County.



- 1 (b) (1) The term of a county superintendent is 4 years beginning on July 1. A county superintendent continues to serve until a successor is appointed and qualifies.
- 3 (2) [By February 1 of the year in which a term ends, the county 4 superintendent shall notify the county board whether the superintendent is a candidate for 5 reappointment.
- 6 (3)] (I) [In] SUBJECT TO SUBPARAGRAPH (II) OF THIS PARAGRAPH,
  7 IN the year in which [a] AN INITIAL term begins, the county board shall appoint a county
  8 superintendent between February 1 and June 30. [However, if the county board decides to
  9 reappoint the incumbent superintendent, the county board shall take final action at a
  10 public meeting no later than March 1 of that year.]
- $\mathbf{A}\mathbf{T}$ 11 (II) ANY **POINT DURING** THE **INCUMBENT** 12 SUPERINTENDENT'S TERM, THE COUNTY BOARD MAY TAKE ACTION AT A PUBLIC 13 MEETING NOT LATER THAN MARCH 1 OF THE YEAR IN WHICH THE CONTRACT IS 14 BEING RENEWED TO REAPPOINT THE INCUMBENT SUPERINTENDENT TO SERVE A 15 NEW TERM OF 4 YEARS BEGINNING THE IMMEDIATELY FOLLOWING JULY 1.
- [(4)] (3) If a county board is unable to appoint a county superintendent by July 1 of a year in which a term begins, the provisions of subsection (d) of this section apply.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 2025.
