1 AN ACT concerning

Office of Social Equity - Community Reinvestment and Repair Fund - Advisory Board and Modifications

FOR the purpose of requiring the Office of Social Equity, rather than the Comptroller, to 4 $\mathbf{5}$ administer the Community Reinvestment and Repair Fund; repealing provisions of 6 law requiring the Office of Social Equity to report on the Community Reinvestment 7 and Repair Fund and to solicit public input on the uses of the Fund and publish a 8 review of the input; requiring the Office to oversee the appropriation of funds from 9 the Fund and to train fund recipients; establishing the Community Reinvestment 10 and Repair Advisory Board; altering certain limitations on the use of the Fund; 11 limiting certain administrative costs to administer the Fund to a certain amount; 12 requiring counties to administer funds from the Fund in a certain manner; requiring 13the Office to require each county to develop a plan for the distribution of certain funds to community-based organizations and to report certain information to the 14 Office by a certain date each year; and generally relating to the Community 15Reinvestment and Repair Fund and the Office of Social Equity. 16
