- 17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,

- 1 (c) (1) In BALTIMORE COUNTY AND Calvert County, a police officer may
 2 enforce the provisions of the Maryland Vehicle Law on a private roadway in {Calvert
 3 County} THE COUNTY that is located within a residential subdivision or community and
 4 used for vehicular travel by residents of the subdivision or community.
- 5 (2) FOR THE PERIOD BEGINNING OCTOBER 1, 2025, AND ENDING
 6 JULY 1, 2028, IN BALTIMORE COUNTY, A POLICE OFFICER MAY ENFORCE THE
 7 PROVISIONS OF THE MARYLAND VEHICLE LAW ON A PRIVATE ROADWAY WITHIN
 8 THE QUEEN ANNE VILLAGE COMMUNITY IN OWINGS MILLS THAT IS USED FOR
 9 VEHICULAR TRAFFIC BY RESIDENTS OF THE COMMUNITY.

- 11 (b) (1) A person may not drive a motor vehicle in violation of any provision of this title on any private property that is used by the public in general, or, in BALTIMORE COUNTY AND Calvert County, on any private [road] ROADWAY located within a:
- 14 (I) $\underline{\mathbf{A}}$ residential subdivision or community $\underline{\mathbf{IN}}$ CALVERT COUNTY; 15 $\underline{\mathbf{OR}}$
- 16 (II) FOR THE PERIOD BEGINNING OCTOBER 1, 2025, AND
 17 ENDING JULY 1, 2028, THE QUEEN ANNE VILLAGE COMMUNITY IN OWINGS MILLS
 18 IN BALTIMORE COUNTY.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, on or before September 1, 2028, the Baltimore County Police Department shall report to the members of the Baltimore County Delegation to the General Assembly, in accordance with § 2–1257 of the State Government Article, on the implementation of this Act and whether it has improved compliance with the Maryland Vehicle Law in the Queen Anne Village community in Owings Mills.
- SECTION 2. 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2025. It shall remain effective for a period of 3 years and, at the end of September 30, 2028, this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
