- 13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
 14 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

17 (A) THE PURPOSE OF THIS SECTION IS TO DESIGNATE NOVEMBER 14 EACH 18 YEAR AS "RUBY BRIDGES WALK TO SCHOOL DAY" TO COMMEMORATE RUBY 19 BRIDGES, WHO, ON NOVEMBER 14, 1960, BECAME THE FIRST AFRICAN AMERICAN 20 STUDENT TO INTEGRATE AN ALL-WHITE ELEMENTARY SCHOOL IN NEW ORLEANS, 21 LOUISIANA.

(B) (1) EACH COUNTY BOARD SHALL DEVELOP AND IMPLEMENT A
PROGRAM OF EDUCATION FOR RUBY BRIDGES WALK TO SCHOOL DAY TO BE HELD
ON OR AROUND NOVEMBER 14 EACH YEAR.

1 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 2 1, 2025.
