Established to honor the service and sacrifice of African American veterans, this post has stood as a center for camaraderie, advocacy, and community engagement for over four decades. The project aims to revitalize the facility, ensuring it continues to serve as a place of honor, support, and education for veterans and their families. This rebuild will not only safeguard the rich history of Post 1983 but also provide a modern space to support ongoing programs, outreach, and services that empower local veterans, foster community partnerships, and preserve the legacy of African American military service.

28. Comments

The American Legion Mannie Scott Post No. 193 is currently vacant and inaccessible to the public. Prior to American Legion Mannie Scott Post No. 193s current state, the property was used as an African American-centered meeting space and community recreational facility for wartime veterans, their families, and the surrounding African American community members of Caroline County, Maryland. The American Legion Mannie Scott Post No. 193 project is an urgent priority because the property is currently experiencing persistent development pressures from local communities within Caroline County, Maryland. Post No. 193s building structure is currently deemed uninhabitable and has become a seriously deteriorated and habitually vacant property in critical need of new construction. Mannie Scott Post No. 193 was chartered in 1947 by the American Legion - a United States Veteran association and nonprofit organization created to enhance the well-being of American veterans, their families, military members, and their communities. Post No. 193 is Caroline County's only African American-serving post dedicated to those who have served in active military duty in all branches of Americas Armed Forces.

For the last 20 years, Post No. 193s African American wartime veteran members and the surrounding African American community have made several attempts to rehabilitate the building. In 2018, Former Lieutenant Governor of Maryland, Boyd Rutherford, and the Former Secretary of the Maryland Department of Veterans Affairs, George Owings, visited Post No. 193 to discuss how the state could help its African American veteran members fund the buildings much-needed critical repairs. Despite Post No. 193s previous community efforts to repair and renovate the building, the property is still in very poor condition with severe exterior and interior damage due to a lack of secured funding. If the Mannie Scott Post No. 193 project does not proceed, local African American veterans and all veterans would lack the resources needed to access social service benefits including employment and business guidance, educational advice, health care resources, and personal financial resources. Historically, Post No. 193 has provided African American veterans a sanctuary to build personal bonds with those who have similar shared wartime experiences. Studies have shown that creating safe spaces for veterans increases their mental-health and wellbeing (U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs, 2022).

African American veterans and African American residents of Caroline County, Maryland have lacked access to a safe-space to host educational and recreational community-building activities For many African Americans, the quality of where they live and commune largely shapes their self-perceptions (Pew Research Center, 2022). Additionally, Mannie Scott Post No. 193s members are largely senior citizens who are experiencing a dwindling membership due to its longtime members becoming deceased. Post No. 193 once had more than 100 members and has since dropped to a current roster of about 35 members. New construction will promote an increased membership interest and continue its legacy and community impact to a new generation of local African American veterans.
