10. Description and Purpose of Organization (Limit length to visible area)

AfriThrive Inc. is a community-based nonprofit organization dedicated to addressing food insecurity and promoting health equity among underserved communities, particularly African immigrant and low-income families. Founded in 2019, AfriThrive provides culturally relevant food assistance, community gardening initiatives, nutrition education, and youth development programs to improve food access and overall well-being. The organizations purpose is to empower families through increased access to fresh, nutritious, and culturally appropriate foods while building self-sufficiency through education and sustainable food systems. AfriThrive collaborates with schools, faith-based organizations, local farmers, and community partners to create long-term solutions to hunger and economic challenges.

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit length to visible area)

The Baltimore Community Food Center Project will renovate a facility in Essex, converting it into a hub for food access and economic empowerment. It will serve low-income families, particularly African immigrants, in a high-poverty, food-insecure area. This initiative will expand food distribution and integrate essential wraparound services to address both immediate needs and long-term community resilience. The project will introduce a community kitchen, cold storage, and a food pantry space, ensuring families have access to fresh, culturally relevant foods. Additionally, youth mentoring and financial literacy programs will equip families with critical life skills, building self-sufficiency. Renovations will include ADA-compliant upgrades, a caf space, and dedicated areas for financial education, and youth mentorship. The project also prioritizes food procurement, allocating funds to purchase and distribute nutritious, culturally appropriate foods.
