The Entrepreneurs Helping Entrepreneurs Training & Entrepreneurship Program provides our young leaders with services such as Mentoring (1 on 1/or group), Social Skills, Effective Communication, Business Ownership, Financial Literacy/Budgeting & Money Management, Case Management, Cooking, Nutrition, Stress and Anger Management, Decision Making, and

Relationship-building Workshops.

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit length to visible area)

In the Carrolton Ridge Community the youth will be doing the plumbing, electric HVAC flooring, roofing, and painting. They are operating under licensed contractors in an apprenticeship program. Age range will be from 14-24. The program will function under the Life as an Entrepreneur curriculum broken into 4 sections, which is Research, Create, Grind and Repeat. The goal of this program is to build community involvement and development. The RESEARCH phase teaches the community how to learn what their educational interests are through history of past obstacles and challenges. CREATE phase instruction entails business structure which includes creation of business plan, logo, and how to manufacture merchandise internally. GRIND phase instruction teaches how to strategize through long term goal planning in business as an entrepreneur. The REPEAT phase is the instruction of financial literacy which includes workshops on stock market, crypto currency and real estate.

As a result of our partnerships with 52 Baltimore City Schools and several recreation centers.

Hundreds of youths were provided hands-on job training experiences through EHE and obtained opportunities to work at various concession stands (funnel cake, cotton candy, hot dog, snowball carts, and other business ventures) around the city of Baltimore.

Transportation is provided for young business owners ensuring a safe and reliable way back

and forth to the program.

Youth between the ages of 10 and 17, make up 21% of Baltimore Citys population (Baltimore City Health Department 2016). EHE undergirds the youth experience by providing them with tools to break down barriers and overcome adversity. As we continue to teach our young business owners coping skills, addressing the social economic crisis by creating an impact in the Carrolton Ridge community.
