The Great Frederick Fair, Inc. (GFF) seeks funding for a \$1.5 million stage roof upgrade to enhance performances, expand audience capacity, and generate revenue to support its mission of agricultural education. For 163 years, GFF has promoted agriculture through its annual nine-day fair, hosting 6,000+ exhibitors, 18,000 entries, and 5,000 student field trips. Partnering with Frederick County Public Schools, GFF provides agricultural curriculum to 18,000+ students. The improved stage will boost tourism, support local businesses, and enable year-round events, strengthening GFFs impact for future generations.

The Great Frederick Fair, Inc. (GFF) is seeking funding through the Legislative Bond Initiative Grant to support the construction of an upgraded stage roof at the Frederick Fairgrounds. This \$1.5 million project will enhance the Fairs ability to attract higher-caliber performers, increase audience capacity, and generate additional revenueultimately reinforcing GFFs mission of promoting agriculture and youth education.

For 163 years, GFF has been a cornerstone of Frederick Countys agricultural community, hosting an annual nine-day fair with over 6,000 exhibitors and 18,000 competitive entries. More than 400 youth exhibitors benefit from scholarship opportunities, educational workshops, and livestock sales, while nearly 18,000 students receive agriculture-based curriculum materials through a partnership with Frederick County Public Schools. Additionally, 5,000 elementary students attend the Fair as part of Frederick Countys largest agricultural classroom experience.

The Fairs entertainment lineupincluding concerts, motorsports, and a midway carnivaldrives attendance and generates essential funding that directly supports its educational programs. Improving the stage infrastructure will allow GFF to expand its offerings, increase tourism and economic impact through hotel stays and local business patronage, and create new opportunities for year-round public events and rentals.

Investing in this stage roof upgrade will ensure the Fairs continued success in educating future generations while contributing to the local economy. We respectfully request legislative support to help fund this vital project, strengthening both our agricultural mission and community engagement for years to come.
