Since its inception, Ivymount has focused on meeting the needs of students for whom limited educational & therapeutic options exist. The complexity of their needs requires programs that are modeled on the integration of safe & appropriate facilities, therapeutic services, differentiated educational instruction, & the provision of tools & strategies. The Maddux School serves young children w/mild to moderate learning & social development challenges. Outreach programs meet the needs of our community
