A commercial refrigerator and freezer will allow us to store more fresh and frozen food, reducing waste and increasing distribution capacity. Parking lot repairs are essential due to damage from 18-wheeler food deliveries, ensuring safety for volunteers and recipients. Pallet jacks will improve efficiency by making it easier to unload and transport heavy food pallets. This project will increase food storage, improve safety, and streamline distribution, allowing us to serve more families effectively. Funding will strengthen our mission to provide sustainable food access and build a healthier community.
