10. Description and Purpose of Organization (Limit length to visible area)

Shomrim of Baltimore, Inc. is a nonprofit organization dedicated to enhancing public safety, supporting victims of crime, and fostering community well-being. Our trained volunteers provide crime deterrence, rapid response, observe and report incidents, and collaborate closely with law enforcement. Shomrim offers victim advocacy services, including on-scene support, follow-up assistance, and guidance through legal processes. Our mission is to create a safer community through crime prevention, strategic advocacy, security assessments, and educational programs.

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit length to visible area)

Shomrim of Baltimore is seeking funding to purchase and develop a centrally located property at Greenspring and Willow Glen in 21209. The site will serve as a secure hub for housing organization vehicles and equipment, enabling rapid response and improved operational efficiency. The project also includes the creation of a nature area with indigenous plants and wildlife viewing, adjacent to existing wetlands and a rainwater culvert. This dual-purpose development will enhance community safety, contribute to local environmental conservation efforts, and promote community wellbeing.
