**Caroline County - Alcoholic Beverages - Multiple Event Licenses**

---

This bill establishes a rural special event venue beer, wine, and liquor license in Caroline County and authorizes the Caroline County Board of License Commissioners to issue the license to owners of venues zoned for rural special events under county law, as specified. The license holder is authorized to sell beer, wine, and liquor for on-premises consumption. The license holder may sell beer, wine, and liquor from 9:00 a.m. to 11:00 p.m. on the day of a rural special event. The license fee is (1) \$250 for up to 10 events per year, (2) \$500 for up to 20 events per year, (3) \$750 for up to 30 events per year, and (4) \$1,000 for up to 40 events per year. A license holder must purchase all alcoholic beverages from a licensed wholesaler, and the license may not be transferred to another location. The bill also authorizes the holder of a multiple event license or a rural special event license to store alcoholic beverages on the licensed premises between individual licensed events, as specified. **The bill takes effect July 1, 2025.**

**Fiscal Summary**

**State Effect:** None.

**Local Effect:** Caroline County revenues increase, beginning in FY 2026, to the extent that rural special event venue beer, wine, and liquor licenses are issued under this bill. Caroline County can handle any additional enforcement activity with existing resources.

**Small Business Effect:** Minimal.

**Analysis**

**Current Law:** Caroline County offers various temporary licenses including a tasting license, per diem licenses, and multiple event licenses.

Volunteer fire companies can store alcoholic beverages to be sold at licensed events if the beverages are stored in a specially identified locked and secured location and are not sold or consumed except during licensed event hours. The fire companies must keep complete and accurate records of all alcoholic beverages purchased and sold on the licensed premises, as specified. License holders that violate this section are subject to a fine of \$100 for the first offense and for subsequent offenses, a fine up to \$500 and denial of future requests for a license for events.
