## FISCAL AND POLICY NOTE First Reader

House Bill 1174

(Montgomery County Delegation)

**Economic Matters** 

#### Montgomery County - Alcoholic Beverages - Class BD-BWL Licenses - Multiple Licenses MC 18-25

This bill increases, from one to two, the maximum number of Class BD-BWL licenses a licensee may hold in Montgomery County, as specified. If a person holds more than one Class BD-BWL license, the second license that is issued to the holder authorizes the holder to sell, on the premises described in the second license (1) beer, wine, and liquor for on-premises consumption and (2) only private-label products manufactured exclusively for the holder for off-premises consumption. The bill also makes conforming changes. **The bill takes effect July 1, 2025.** 

### **Fiscal Summary**

State Effect: None.

**Local Effect:** Montgomery County can handle any additional enforcement activity with existing resources. Montgomery County revenues increase to the extent additional Class BD-BWL licenses are issued under the bill.

**Small Business Effect:** Minimal.

#### **Analysis**

**Current Law:** In Montgomery County, the Class BD-BWL license authorizes the license holder to sell beer and wine for on- or off-premises consumption, in addition to liquor for on-premises consumption. As a prerequisite for the initial issuance of the license, the owner of the establishment must attest in a sworn statement that food will be available for sale for on-premises consumption during the hours that alcoholic beverages are permitted to be served. The Montgomery County Board of License Commissioners by regulation must

specify the type of food that is required to be available for sale for on-premises consumption during the hours that alcoholic beverages are permitted to be served. The holder of a Class BD-BWL license (1) may also hold a Class 7 micro-brewery license issued for a location in the county but (2) may not hold more than one Class B-BWL license. The annual license fee is \$3,500.

Multiple licenses may be issued for the same premises or to an individual for the use of that individual, a partnership, a corporation, an unincorporated association, or a limited liability company if (1) the licenses are Class H beer and wine licenses and (2) each premises is a restaurant in a bowling establishment that has at least 30 lanes with automatic pinsetters.

Except as otherwise provided under current law, the board may not authorize the same license holder to hold more than 10 licenses. The 10 licenses that may be held by the same license holder may include (1) one or more Class H-BW licenses and one or more Class B-K licenses and (2) may not include more than one Class B-BWL license.

Local Fiscal Effect: Montgomery County revenues increase to the extent additional Class BD-BWL licenses are issued to current license holders, under the bill. The annual license fee for a Class BD-BWL licenses is \$3,500, and Montgomery County advises there are currently 52 Class BD-BWL alcoholic beverages licenses issued in the county as of February 2025. Montgomery County further advises there is an initial application fee of \$600 for each new alcoholic beverages license and a \$100 renewal fee. For illustrative purposes only, if each holder of a Class BD-BWL alcoholic beverages license in the county applies for a second license and continues to maintain that second license, Montgomery County revenues increase by \$213,200 in fiscal 2026 and by \$187,200 annually thereafter.
