### FISCAL AND POLICY NOTE First Reader

Senate Bill 304 Finance

#### Baltimore City - Alcoholic Beverages - 45th Alcoholic Beverages District -Licenses

This bill authorizes the Baltimore City Board of License Commissioners to issue a Class C beer, wine, and liquor license in the 400 block of East Oliver Street in the 45th alcoholic beverages district, as specified. The bill also establishes a geographic boundary in the 45th alcoholic beverages district within which a Class A beer, wine, and liquor license holder or a Class B-D-7 beer, wine, and liquor license holder may only sell alcoholic beverages during specified hours. **The bill takes effect July 1, 2025.** 

#### **Fiscal Summary**

State Effect: None.

Local Effect: The bill does not materially affect Baltimore City finances or operations.

**Small Business Effect:** Minimal.

#### Analysis

**Bill Summary:** This bill authorizes the board to issue a Class C beer, wine, and liquor license in the 400 block of East Oliver Street in the 45th alcoholic beverages district only if (1) the applicant does not convert the license to a different license class; (2) alcoholic beverages are served outdoors only to patrons seated at tables or standing in a courtyard area; (3) the applicant does not allow the off-premises sale of alcoholic beverages; (4) alcoholic beverages sales do not begin earlier than 10:00 a.m.; and (5) the applicant executes a memorandum of understanding with the Greenmount West Community Association.

Additionally, the bill authorizes the holders of a Class A beer, wine, and liquor license or a Class B-D-7 beer, wine, and liquor license to sell beer, wine, and liquor from 9:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m. in a specified area. For a license holder within the bounded area, the hours of sale (1) may not begin before 9:00 a.m. or end after 10:00 p.m. and (2) may not be extended if they begin later than 9:00 a.m. or end before 10:00 p.m.

**Current Law:** Generally, the board is prohibited from issuing new alcoholic beverage licenses in the 40th, 41st, 43rd, 44th, and 45th alcoholic beverages districts, except under specific circumstances.

The board may issue a one-day license or a Class B beer, wine, and liquor license to restaurants in these districts if they meet a minimum capital investment of \$200,000 (excluding land and buildings) and have a seating capacity of at least 75 individuals.

Additionally, Class C beer, wine, and liquor licenses may be issued in certain locations within the 40th, 44th, and 45th districts. Several Class B-D-7 licenses may also be issued in designated areas, provided applicants meet food sales requirements, execute memorandums of understanding with community associations, and comply with other licensing conditions.

A Class A beer, wine, and liquor license holder may sell alcohol Monday through Saturday from 9:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m. in the Park Heights Master Plan area and from 6 a.m. to midnight elsewhere in the city. On select Sundays between Thanksgiving and New Year's Day, sales are permitted from 1:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m., provided the licensee pays a supplementary fee of \$120 per Sunday by September 30. Additionally, the license holder may sell on two other Sundays during the year by paying the same fee at least two weeks in advance.
