House Bill 587 Ways and Means (Delegate Patterson, et al.)

Education - High School Diploma - Veterans of Armed Conflicts

This bill expands the honorably discharged veterans eligible to receive high school diplomas by including those who left a public or private school to enlist in the U.S. Armed Forces during *any* armed conflict authorized by the President of the United States or Congress.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: None. The bill authorizes local boards of education and private schools to issue diplomas to eligible veterans.

Local Effect: Local boards of education can issue diplomas to eligible veterans using existing resources. No effect on revenues.

Small Business Effect: None.

Analysis

Current Law: Honorably discharged veterans may obtain a high school diploma if the individual withdrew from a regular full-time public or private school to enlist in the U.S. armed forces during World War II, the Korean Conflict, or the Vietnam Conflict. The veteran must apply to the local board in the county where the individual resides or where the school from which the individual withdrew was located. Each local board of education must adopt rules and regulations to establish procedures for awarding diplomas for such veterans.

Additional Comments: Private high schools can issue diplomas to eligible veterans using existing resources.
