Somerset County Code of Public Local Laws - 2025 Edition - Legalization

This bill legalizes the 2025 Edition of the Somerset County Code of Public Local Laws and any supplement to it that contains laws enacted by the General Assembly. **The bill takes effect July 1, 2025.**

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: None.

Local Effect: Somerset County publication costs are expected to be minimal in FY 2026 and this amount is likely absorbable within existing budgeted resources.

Small Business Effect: None.

Analysis

Current Law: Somerset County is one of six counties that operate under the commission form of government. Commission counties have limited powers and only those powers that are expressly delegated by the General Assembly. Legalizing changes to the code of public local laws prior to publication of a new compilation must receive approval of the General Assembly.

Additional Comments : If a county makes nonsubstantive revisions to its code of public local laws, the revised code must be “legalized” by the General Assembly to the extent that local laws enacted by the General Assembly and contained in the county’s code are affected by the nonsubstantive revisions. Chapter 253 of 2016 legalized the 2016 edition of the Somerset County Code of Public Local Laws.
