House Bill 1009 Judiciary

#### **Baltimore City - Ordinance Enforcement - Amount of Fines and Penalties**

This bill increases, from \$1,000 to \$10,000, the maximum civil and criminal fines and penalties Baltimore City may impose for the violation of any ordinance, rule, or regulation established by the city, as specified.

#### **Fiscal Summary**

State Effect: The bill does not materially affect State operations or finances.

**Local Effect:** Baltimore City revenues may increase, beginning in FY 2026, to the extent that higher fines or penalties are imposed for civil or criminal offenses. Baltimore City expenditures are not affected.

Small Business Effect: None.

### Analysis

**Current Law:** Baltimore City is authorized to provide civil and criminal fines and penalties for the violation of any ordinance, rule, or regulation established by the city, as specified. The maximum fine or penalty for these violations is \$1,000.

In fiscal 2023, Baltimore City collected \$7.7 million in fines that were imposed by the Baltimore City Environmental Control Board. In addition, Baltimore City collected \$3,140 from civil citations.
