

Chapter 335

(Senate Bill 83)

AN ACT concerning

Health Occupations – Grounds for Discipline – Federal and Court Actions

FOR the purpose of altering the grounds for discipline by certain health occupations boards to include being disciplined by any branch of the uniformed services or the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs; altering the grounds for discipline of a naturopathic doctor by the State Board of Physicians to include being convicted or disciplined by a court of any state or country; and generally relating to the grounds for discipline by health occupations boards.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

(a) Subject to the hearing provisions of § 4–318 of this subtitle, the Board may deny a general license to practice dentistry, a limited license to practice dentistry, or a teacher’s license to practice dentistry to any applicant, reprimand any licensed dentist, place any licensed dentist on probation, or suspend or revoke the license of any licensed dentist, if the applicant or licensee:

(21) Is disciplined by a licensing or disciplinary authority of any other state or country or convicted or disciplined by a court of any state or country, **OR DISCIPLINED BY ANY BRANCH OF THE UNIFORMED SERVICES OR THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS AFFAIRS**, for an act that would be grounds for disciplinary action under the Board’s disciplinary statutes;

(c) Subject to the hearing provisions of § 4–318 of this subtitle, the Board may deny a general license to practice dental hygiene, a teacher’s license to practice dental hygiene, or a temporary license to practice dental hygiene to any applicant, reprimand any licensed dental hygienist, place any licensed dental hygienist on probation, or suspend or revoke the license of any licensed dental hygienist, if the applicant or licensee:

(6) Is disciplined by a licensing or disciplinary authority of any other state or country or convicted or disciplined by a court of any state or country, **OR DISCIPLINED BY ANY BRANCH OF THE UNIFORMED SERVICES OR THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS AFFAIRS**, for an act that would be grounds for disciplinary action under the Board’s disciplinary statutes;

5–101.

(12) Is disciplined by a licensing or disciplinary authority of any other state or country or convicted or disciplined by a court of any other state or country, **OR DISCIPLINED BY ANY BRANCH OF THE UNIFORMED SERVICES OR THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS AFFAIRS**, for an act that would be grounds for disciplinary action under [this section] **THE BOARD’S DISCIPLINARY STATUTES**;

(20) Has had a license to practice optometry denied, suspended or revoked in another state, **OR HAS BEEN DISCIPLINED BY ANY BRANCH OF THE UNIFORMED SERVICES OR THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS AFFAIRS**, for an act which would be grounds for disciplinary action under [this section] **THE BOARD'S DISCIPLINARY STATUTES**;

12-101.

(a) In this title the following words have the meanings indicated.

(d) "Board" means the State Board of Pharmacy.

(b) Subject to the hearing provisions of § 12-315 of this subtitle, the Board, on the affirmative vote of a majority of its members then serving, may deny a license to any applicant for a pharmacist's license, reprimand any licensee, place any licensee on probation, or suspend or revoke a license of a pharmacist if the applicant or licensee:

(24) Is disciplined by a licensing or disciplinary authority of any state or country or convicted or disciplined by a court of any state or country, **OR DISCIPLINED BY ANY BRANCH OF THE UNIFORMED SERVICES OR THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS AFFAIRS**, for an act that would be grounds for disciplinary action under the Board's disciplinary statutes;

13-101.

13-316.

Subject to the hearing provisions of § 13-317 of this subtitle, the Board may deny a license or restricted license to any applicant, reprimand any licensee or holder of a restricted license, place any licensee or holder of a restricted license on probation, or suspend or revoke a license or restricted license if the applicant, licensee, or holder:

(10) Is disciplined by a licensing or disciplinary authority of any state or country or convicted or disciplined by a court of any state or country, or disciplined by any branch of the uniformed services or [Veterans Administration] **U.S. DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS AFFAIRS**, for an act that would be grounds for disciplinary action under the Board's disciplinary statutes;

14-101.

14–404.

of the uniformed services or the [Veterans Administration] **U.S. DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS AFFAIRS**, for an act that would be grounds for disciplinary action under [this section] **THE BOARD'S DISCIPLINARY STATUTES**;

14-5E-01.

15–101.

(a) Subject to the hearing provisions of § 15–315 of this subtitle, a disciplinary panel, on the affirmative vote of a majority of the quorum, may reprimand any physician assistant, place any physician assistant on probation, or suspend or revoke a license if the physician assistant:

(21) Is disciplined by a licensing or disciplinary authority or convicted or disciplined by a court of any state or country, or disciplined by any branch of the uniformed services or the [Veterans’ Administration] **U.S. DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS AFFAIRS**, for an act that would be grounds for disciplinary action under [this section] **THE BOARD’S DISCIPLINARY STATUTES**;

16–101.

- (a) In this title the following words have the meanings indicated.
- (b) “Board” means the State Board of Podiatric Medical Examiners.

16–311.

(a) Subject to the hearing provisions of § 16–313 of this subtitle, the Board, on the affirmative vote of a majority of its members then serving, may deny a license or a limited license to any applicant, reprimand any licensee or holder of a limited license, impose an administrative monetary penalty not exceeding \$50,000 on any licensee or holder of a limited license, place any licensee or holder of a limited license on probation, or suspend or revoke a license or a limited license if the applicant, licensee, or holder:

(21) Has been disciplined by a licensing or disciplinary authority of any state or country or convicted or disciplined by a court of any state or country, or disciplined by any branch of the uniformed services or the [United States Veterans Administration] **U.S. DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS AFFAIRS**, for an act that would be grounds for disciplinary action under [this section] **THE BOARD’S DISCIPLINARY STATUTES**;

17–101.

(a) In this title the following words have the meanings indicated.

(e) “Board” means the State Board of Professional Counselors and Therapists.

17–6A–19.

Subject to the hearing provisions of § 17–6A–21 of this subtitle, the Board, on the affirmative vote of a majority of its members then serving, may deny a license to any applicant, reprimand any licensee, place any licensee on probation, or suspend or revoke a license of any licensee if the applicant or licensee:

(10) Is disciplined by a licensing or disciplinary authority of any state or country or convicted or disciplined by a court of any state or country, or disciplined by any branch of the uniformed services or the [United States Veterans Administration] **U.S. DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS AFFAIRS**, for an act that would be grounds for disciplinary action under the Board’s disciplinary statutes;

18–101.

(a) In this title the following words have the meanings indicated.

(b) “Board” means the State Board of Examiners of Psychologists.

18–313.

Subject to the hearing provisions of § 18–315 of this subtitle, the Board, on the affirmative vote of a majority of its members then serving, may deny a license or registration to any applicant, reprimand any licensee or registrant, place any licensee or

registrant on probation, or suspend or revoke a license or registration of any licensee or registrant if the applicant, licensee, or registrant:

(11) Is disciplined by a licensing or disciplinary authority of any state or country or convicted or disciplined by a court of any state or country, or disciplined by any branch of the uniformed services or the [United States Veterans Administration] **U.S. DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS AFFAIRS**, for an act that would be grounds for disciplinary action under the Board's disciplinary statutes;

19-101.

- (a) In this title the following words have the meanings indicated.
- (b) "Board" means the State Board of Social Work Examiners.

19-311.

Subject to the hearing provisions of § 19-312 of this subtitle, the Board may deny a license to any applicant, fine a licensee, reprimand any licensee, place any licensee on probation, or suspend or revoke a license if the applicant or licensee:

(9) Is disciplined by a licensing or disciplinary authority of any state[,] OR country[, or branch of the armed services, or the Veterans' Administration] **OR CONVICTED OR DISCIPLINED BY A COURT OF ANY STATE OR COUNTRY, OR DISCIPLINED BY ANY BRANCH OF THE UNIFORMED SERVICES OR THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS AFFAIRS**, for an act that would be grounds for disciplinary action under [this section] **THE BOARD'S DISCIPLINARY STATUTES**;

21-101.

- (a) In this title the following words have the meanings indicated.
- (b) "Board" means the State Board of Environmental Health Specialists.

21-312.

(b) Subject to the hearing provisions of § 21-313 of this subtitle, the Board, on the affirmative vote of a majority of its full authorized membership, may deny any applicant licensure, reprimand any licensee, or place any individual who is licensed on probation, or suspend or revoke a license, if the applicant or licensee:

(7) Is disciplined by a licensing or disciplinary authority of any other state or country or convicted or disciplined by a court of any state or country, **OR DISCIPLINED BY ANY BRANCH OF THE UNIFORMED SERVICES OR THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF**

VETERANS AFFAIRS, for an act that would be grounds for disciplinary action under the Board's disciplinary statutes;

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2026.
