A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Education – Dependent Children of Active Service Members – Advance**
3 **Enrollment Procedures**

4 FOR the purpose of requiring a county superintendent of schools to allow a certain
5 dependent child of an active service member to advance enroll in a school in the
6 county in a certain manner; requiring the remote registration process to provide an
7 opportunity for the active service member or other parent or guardian of a dependent
8 child with a disability to make a certain note during the registration process;
9 requiring a county board of education to ensure that a dependent child with a
10 disability continues to receive a certain education without undue delay through a
11 certain method; requiring the Secretary of Veterans and Military Families, in
12 consultation with certain entities, to publish and maintain certain information on
13 school enrollment and related services for dependent children of active service
14 members; and generally relating to school enrollment procedures for dependent
15 children of active service members.

26 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
27 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

3 (a) (1) In this section the following words have the meanings indicated.

4 (2) "CHILD WITH A DISABILITY" HAS THE MEANING STATED IN §
5 8-401 OF THIS ARTICLE.

9 **[(3)] (4)** “Enrollment” includes course registration and charter school
10 lotteries.

15 (b) (1) [A] SUBJECT TO PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS SUBSECTION AND
16 SUBSECTION (C) OF THIS SECTION, A county superintendent shall allow a dependent
17 child of an active service member who is relocating to the State on official orders and is not
18 domiciled in that county during the enrollment period to apply for ADVANCE enrollment in
19 a public school in the county[, in the same manner and at the same time as individuals
20 domiciled in the county].

18 (c) (1) [Within] **TO FINALIZE ADVANCE ENROLLMENT UNDER THIS**
19 **SECTION, WITHIN** 10 days of the published arrival date on the active service member's
20 official orders, the active service member shall provide the school with:

(i) Satisfactory evidence of the dependent child's status as a dependent child of the active service member;

23 (ii) A copy of the active service member's official orders to relocate;
24 and

25 (iii) Proof of residence in the county.

26 (2) The active service member may use the address of any of the following
27 as proof of residence:

28 (i) A temporary on-base lodging facility;

29 (ii) A purchased or leased home or apartment; or

(iii) Any federal government housing unit or off-base military housing unit.

1 (D) (1) NOTWITHSTANDING ANY OTHER PROVISION OF LAW, A
2 DEPENDENT CHILD OF AN ACTIVE SERVICE MEMBER WHO HAS USED ADVANCE
3 ENROLLMENT TO ENROLL IN A SCHOOL UNDER THIS SECTION MAY REMAIN
4 ENROLLED IN SCHOOL UNTIL THE END OF THE CURRENT SCHOOL YEAR, EVEN IF THE
5 CHILD NO LONGER MEETS RESIDENCY REQUIREMENTS OF THE SCHOOL.

6 (2) A DEPENDENT CHILD OF AN ACTIVE SERVICE MEMBER WHO USES
7 ADVANCE ENROLLMENT SHALL HAVE ACCESS TO ACADEMIC COURSES AND
8 PROGRAMS, INCLUDING EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES AND ATHLETIC AND SOCIAL
9 PROGRAMS, IN THE SAME MANNER AS OTHER STUDENTS ENROLLED IN THE SCHOOL.

10 (E) THE SECRETARY OF VETERANS AND MILITARY FAMILIES, IN
11 CONSULTATION WITH THE MILITARY FAMILY EDUCATION LIAISON DESIGNATED
12 UNDER § 7-1303 OF THIS TITLE AND THE OFFICE OF MILITARY AND FEDERAL
13 AFFAIRS AND THE MARYLAND MILITARY INSTALLATION COUNCIL IN THE
14 DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE, SHALL PUBLISH AND MAINTAIN INFORMATION ON:

15 (1) THE ADVANCE ENROLLMENT PROCEDURES ESTABLISHED UNDER
16 THIS SECTION; AND

17 (2) ANY ASSISTANCE AND SERVICES AVAILABLE TO ACTIVE SERVICE
18 MEMBERS REGARDING THE ADVANCE ENROLLMENT OF A DEPENDENT CHILD,
19 INCLUDING A CHILD WITH A DISABILITY ENTITLED TO RECEIVE A FREE
20 APPROPRIATE PUBLIC EDUCATION IN THE STATE.

22 (a) (1) In this subtitle the following words have the meanings indicated.

23 (2) "Child with a disability" means a child who has been determined
24 through appropriate assessment as having autism, deaf-blindness, hearing impairment,
25 including deafness, emotional disability, intellectual disability, multiple disabilities,
26 orthopedic impairment, other health impairment, specific learning disability, speech or
27 language impairment, traumatic brain injury, visual impairment, including blindness, and
28 who because of that impairment needs special education and related services.

29 (3) "Free appropriate public education" means special education and
30 related services that:

31 (i) Are provided at public expense, under public supervision and
32 direction, at no cost to the parents;

33 (ii) Meet the standards of the State Board regulations and the
34 Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (20 U.S.C. 1400 et seq.);

(iii) Includes preschool, elementary, and secondary education; and

(iv) Are provided in conformance with the requirements of the child's education program.

4 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July
5 1, 2026.
