1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Family Law – Child Support – Assignment of Rights**

3 FOR the purpose of authorizing the Child Support Administration to take action to secure
4 an assignment to the State of any rights to support on behalf of a child receiving
5 foster care maintenance payments under certain circumstances; requiring a court to
6 terminate a child support order that was previously established or assigned for a
7 child receiving a foster care maintenance payment under certain circumstances; and
8 generally relating to child support.

19 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
20 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

21 **Article – Family Law**

2 (a) In this subtitle the following words have the meanings indicated.

3 (b) "Administration" means:

4 (1) the Social Services Administration of the Department; or

5 (2) any other unit within the Department to which the Secretary of Human
6 Services has delegated in writing specified responsibilities of the Administration under this
7 subtitle.

9 **(A) ONLY IN LIMITED CIRCUMSTANCES, WHERE THE ADMINISTRATION**
10 **FINDS IT APPROPRIATE, MAY ACTION BE TAKEN TO SECURE AN ASSIGNMENT TO THE**
11 **STATE OF ANY RIGHTS TO SUPPORT ON BEHALF OF A CHILD RECEIVING FOSTER**
12 **CARE MAINTENANCE PAYMENTS UNDER THIS PART III OF THIS SUBTITLE.**

13 **(B) THE ADMINISTRATION MAY TAKE ACTION, WHEN APPROPRIATE, TO**
14 **DISCONTINUE AN ASSIGNMENT OF RIGHTS TO SUPPORT AND TERMINATE EXISTING**
15 **SUPPORT ORDERS FOR A CHILD RECEIVING FOSTER CARE MAINTENANCE**
16 **PAYMENTS.**

17 **(C) THE SECRETARY OF HUMAN SERVICES SHALL ADOPT RULES AND**
18 **REGULATIONS TO IMPLEMENT THIS SECTION.**

20 (a) The court may modify a child support award subsequent to the filing of a
21 motion for modification and upon a showing of a material change of circumstance.

22 (b) The court may not retroactively modify a child support award prior to the date
23 of the filing of the motion for modification.

24 (c) If a party becomes incarcerated, the court may determine that a material
25 change of circumstance warranting a modification of child support has occurred, provided
26 that the party's ability to pay child support is sufficiently reduced due to incarceration.

28 **THE COURT SHALL TERMINATE A CHILD SUPPORT ORDER THAT WAS**
29 **PREVIOUSLY ESTABLISHED OR ASSIGNED FOR A CHILD RECEIVING A FOSTER CARE**
30 **MAINTENANCE PAYMENT, WITHOUT A SHOWING OF A MATERIAL CHANGE OF**

1 CIRCUMSTANCE, ON THE FILING FOR A TERMINATION BY THE CHILD SUPPORT
2 ADMINISTRATION, LOCAL OFFICE OF CHILD SUPPORT, OR LOCAL DEPARTMENT,
3 AFTER THE SOCIAL SERVICES ADMINISTRATION OR ITS DESIGNEE DETERMINES
4 THAT THE ORDER IS NO LONGER APPROPRIATE.

5 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
6 October 1, 2026.
