1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Anne Arundel County – Board of License Commissioners – Chief Inspector –**
3 **Compensation**

4 FOR the purpose of increasing the minimum and maximum salary amounts for the chief
5 inspector employed by the Board of License Commissioners for Anne Arundel
6 County; and generally relating to alcoholic beverages and the Board of License
7 Commissioners for Anne Arundel County.

18 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
19 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

20 **Article – Alcoholic Beverages and Cannabis**

21 11–102.

22 This title applies only in Anne Arundel County.

23 11–204.

(b) (2) The Board shall employ:

(i) a full-time executive director whose annual salary shall be fixed by the Board as in a general county classified salary schedule, within pay grade 17;

(ii) a full-time administrator whose annual salary shall be fixed by the Board as in a general county classified salary schedule, within pay grade 16;

(iii) two full-time secretaries whose annual salaries shall be fixed by the Board as in a general county classified salary schedule, within pay grade 13;

(iv) a full-time chief inspector whose annual salary shall be fixed by the Board as in a general county classified salary schedule, within non-represented pay schedule ~~[NR-05]~~ **NR-15**; and

(v) an attorney at an annual salary of \$60,000.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2026.
