## CHAPTER \_\_\_\_\_

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Public Health – Expedited Partner Therapy – Bacterial Vaginosis and Licensed**  
3 **Certified Midwives**

4 FOR the purpose of adding bacterial vaginosis to the list of diagnoses for which certain  
5 health care ~~providers~~ practitioners may prescribe, dispense, or otherwise provide  
6 antibiotic therapy to a sexual partner of a diagnosed patient without making a  
7 certain assessment of the sexual partner; adding licensed certified midwives to the  
8 list of health care practitioners who may prescribe, dispense, or otherwise provide  
9 antibiotic therapy to a sexual partner of a diagnosed patient without making a  
10 certain assessment of the sexual partner; and generally relating to expedited partner  
11 therapy.

17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,  
18 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

2 (a) The purpose of expedited partner therapy is to provide antibiotic therapy to  
3 any partner of a patient diagnosed with ~~a sexually transmitted infection~~ **AN INFECTION**  
4 **TRANSMITTED THROUGH SEXUAL ACTIVITY** identified in subsection (b) of this section in  
5 order to:

6 (1) Contain and stop the further spread of the infection; and

7 (2) Reduce the likelihood of reinfection in the diagnosed patient.

8 (b) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the following health care  
9 providers may prescribe, dispense, or otherwise provide antibiotic therapy to [any] A sexual  
10 partner of a patient diagnosed with chlamydia, gonorrhea, [or] trichomoniasis, **OR**  
11 **BACTERIAL VAGINOSIS** without making a personal physical assessment of the patient's  
12 partner:

13 (1) A physician licensed under Title 14 of the Health Occupations Article;

14 (2) An advanced practice registered nurse with prescriptive authority  
15 licensed under Title 8 of the Health Occupations Article acting in accordance with § 8-508  
16 of the Health Occupations Article;

17 (3) An authorized physician assistant licensed under Title 15 of the Health  
18 Occupations Article acting in accordance with § 15-302.2 of the Health Occupations Article;  
19 ~~and~~

20 (4) A registered nurse employed by a local health department who complies  
21 with:

22 (i) The formulary developed and approved under § 3-403(b) of this  
23 article; and

24 (ii) The requirements established under § 8-512 of the Health  
25 Occupations Article; **AND**

26 **(5) A CERTIFIED MIDWIFE LICENSED UNDER TITLE 8, SUBTITLE 6D**  
27 **OF THE HEALTH OCCUPATIONS ARTICLE.**

28 (c) This section may not be construed to otherwise expand the prescribing or  
29 dispensing authority of an advanced practice registered nurse with prescriptive authority  
30 or a physician assistant.

31 (d) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, a pharmacist licensed under Title  
32 12 of the Health Occupations Article may dispense antibiotic therapy prescribed in  
33 accordance with subsection (b) of this section.

1 (e) The Secretary shall adopt regulations to implement the requirements of this  
2 section in public and private health care settings in the State.

3 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect  
4 October 1, 2026.
