A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Child Care Centers – Teacher Qualifications – Alterations**

3 FOR the purpose of requiring the State Board of Education to provide a pathway for certain
4 individuals to attest to qualifying educational credentials to be a child care teacher
5 teaching in a child care center; and generally relating to the qualifications of a child
6 care teacher.

22 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
23 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

24 **Article – Education**

2 (a) The State Board shall adopt rules and regulations for licensing and operating
3 child care centers.

4 (b) These rules and regulations shall:

5 (13) Subject to subsection [(c)] (D) of this section, establish probationary
6 employment qualifications for an individual who is applying for the first time to be a child
7 care teacher in a child care center in the State that serves preschool or school–age children
8 who are at least 3 years old.

9 (C) (1) **THESE RULES AND REGULATIONS SHALL PROVIDE A PATHWAY**
10 **FOR AN INDIVIDUAL WHO IS QUALIFIED TO BE A CHILD CARE TEACHER, BUT LACKS**
11 **PROOF OF NECESSARY EDUCATIONAL ATTAINMENT, TO ATTEST TO THE QUALIFYING**
12 **EDUCATIONAL CREDENTIALS HELD BY THE INDIVIDUAL.**

13 (2) **THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ESTABLISH A PROCESS TO CARRY OUT**
14 **THIS SUBSECTION.**

15 [(c)] (D) (1) The probationary employment qualifications established under
16 subsection (b)(13) of this section shall allow an individual to be employed as a child care
17 teacher during a probationary period if the individual:

- 18 (i) 1. Is enrolled in approved pre–service training;
- 19 2. Successfully completes the required 90 hours of the
20 approved pre–service training within 6 months after being hired; and
- 21 3. Holds an associate degree or a bachelor’s degree in:
- 22 A. Early childhood education;
- 23 B. Elementary education;
- 24 C. Child development;
- 25 D. Home economics;
- 26 E. Nursing;
- 27 F. Social work;
- 28 G. Special education; or
- 29 H. A related field approved by the Department; or

1 (ii) 1. Is enrolled in approved pre-service training;

2 2. Has successfully completed at least 45 hours of the
3 approved pre-service training at the time the child care center hires the individual;

4 3. Successfully completes the remaining hours of the
5 pre-service training within 6 months after being hired; and

6 4. Holds an associate degree or a bachelor's degree in a field
7 other than a field listed under item (i)3 of this paragraph.

8 (2) If, at the end of the 6-month probationary period, an individual
9 described in paragraph (1) of this subsection has not completed the required pre-service
10 training, the child care center shall, with no further cause, terminate the individual or
11 reassign the individual to a nonteaching position.

12 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July
13 1, 2026.
