A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Public Safety – Gun Violence Victim Relocation Program – Establishment**

3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Gun Violence Victim Relocation Program within the
4 Victim Services Unit of the Governor's Office of Crime Prevention and Policy to
5 provide certain victims of gun violence certain services and assistance related to
6 relocating for the safety of the victim or the victim's family; establishing the Gun
7 Violence Victim Relocation Program Fund as a special, nonlapsing fund; requiring
8 interest earnings of the Fund to be credited to the Fund; requiring the Victim
9 Services Unit to establish a certain oversight commission; and generally relating to
10 the Gun Violence Victim Relocation Program.

11 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
12 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

13 **Article – Criminal Procedure**

14 11–1102.

15 (a) There is a Victim Services Unit in the Governor’s Office of Crime Prevention
16 and Policy.

17 (b) The Unit consists of:

18 (1) the Criminal Injuries Compensation Board under Subtitle 8 of this title;
19 (2) the program for sexual assault forensic examinations under § 11–1007
20 of this title;

21 **(3) THE GUN VIOLENCE VICTIM RELOCATION PROGRAM UNDER**
22 **TITLE 5, SUBTITLE 9 OF THE PUBLIC SAFETY ARTICLE;**

23 **[(3)] (4)** a restitution section; and

24 **[(4)] (5)** any other program that provides victim services under the
25 Governor’s Office of Crime Prevention and Policy that the Executive Director determines
26 would benefit from inclusion under the Unit.

28 **SUBTITLE 9. GUN VIOLENCE VICTIM RELOCATION PROGRAM.**

29 **5–901.**

30 **(A) IN THIS SUBTITLE THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE MEANINGS**
31 **INDICATED.**

(B) "FUND" MEANS THE GUN VIOLENCE VICTIM RELOCATION PROGRAM FUND ESTABLISHED UNDER § 5-906 OF THIS SUBTITLE.

3 (C) "PROGRAM" MEANS THE GUN VIOLENCE VICTIM RELOCATION
4 PROGRAM ESTABLISHED UNDER § 5-902 OF THIS SUBTITLE.

5 (D) "VICTIM SERVICES UNIT" MEANS THE VICTIM SERVICES UNIT WITHIN
6 THE GOVERNOR'S OFFICE OF CRIME PREVENTION AND POLICY ESTABLISHED
7 UNDER § 11-1102 OF THE CRIMINAL PROCEDURE ARTICLE.

9 (A) THERE IS A GUN VIOLENCE VICTIM RELOCATION PROGRAM WITHIN
10 THE VICTIM SERVICES UNIT.

14 (C) THIS SUBTITLE SHALL BE LIBERALLY CONSTRUED AND APPLIED TO
15 PROMOTE ITS UNDERLYING PURPOSE.

16 5-903.

17 (A) (1) AN INDIVIDUAL MAY REQUEST PARTICIPATION IN THE PROGRAM
18 THROUGH THE VICTIM SERVICES UNIT.

19 (2) AN INDIVIDUAL IS ELIGIBLE FOR ASSISTANCE THROUGH THE
20 PROGRAM IF:

21 (I) THE INDIVIDUAL IS A VICTIM OF GUN VIOLENCE IN THE
22 STATE;

(II) 1. THE INDIVIDUAL EXPERIENCED THE VIOLENCE
WITHIN CLOSE PROXIMITY TO THE INDIVIDUAL'S HOME; OR

27 (III) THE INDIVIDUAL DEMONSTRATES A NEED TO BE
28 RELOCATED FOR THE SAFETY OF THE INDIVIDUAL OR THE INDIVIDUAL'S FAMILY.

4 (II) THE VICTIM SERVICES UNIT MAY NOT ACCEPT AN
5 INDIVIDUAL INTO THE PROGRAM IF THE INDIVIDUAL IS SUSPECTED TO HAVE
6 PERPETRATED THE VIOLENCE.

7 (B) THE VICTIM SERVICES UNIT SHALL KEEP THE PERSONAL
8 INFORMATION OF AN INDIVIDUAL WHO APPLIES FOR THE PROGRAM UNDER
9 SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION CONFIDENTIAL, INCLUDING THE ADDRESS AND
10 ANY OTHER IDENTIFYING INFORMATION OF THE INDIVIDUAL.

11 5-904.

12 (A) THE VICTIM SERVICES UNIT SHALL ASSIST AN ELIGIBLE VICTIM
13 ACCEPTED INTO THE PROGRAM BY:

14 (1) RELOCATING THE VICTIM AND THE VICTIM'S FAMILY TO A SAFE
15 LOCATION;

16 (2) PROVIDING THE VICTIM WITH FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE FOR
17 MOVING EXPENSES, SECURITY DEPOSIT, AND RENT; AND

21 (B) THE VICTIM SERVICES UNIT SHALL:

22 (1) COLLABORATE WITH OTHER STATE AND LOCAL AGENCIES,
23 INCLUDING LAW ENFORCEMENT, HOUSING AUTHORITIES, AND SOCIAL SERVICES, TO
24 PROVIDE COMPREHENSIVE SERVICES TO VICTIMS UNDER THE PROGRAM;

31 (C) THE VICTIM SERVICES UNIT SHALL ADOPT RULES AND REGULATIONS

1 NECESSARY TO CARRY OUT THE PROVISIONS OF THIS SUBTITLE.

2 **5-905.**

3 THE VICTIM SERVICES UNIT SHALL ESTABLISH AN APPEAL PROCESS FOR AN
4 INDIVIDUAL DETERMINED TO BE INELIGIBLE AND DENIED ASSISTANCE UNDER THE
5 PROGRAM.

6 **5-906.**

7 (A) THERE IS A GUN VIOLENCE VICTIM RELOCATION PROGRAM FUND.

8 (B) THE PURPOSE OF THE FUND IS TO CARRY OUT THE PROVISIONS OF THIS
9 SUBTITLE.

10 (C) THE VICTIM SERVICES UNIT SHALL ADMINISTER THE FUND.

11 (D) (1) THE FUND IS A SPECIAL, NONLAPSING FUND THAT IS NOT
12 SUBJECT TO § 7-302 OF THE STATE FINANCE AND PROCUREMENT ARTICLE.

13 (2) THE STATE TREASURER SHALL HOLD THE FUND SEPARATELY,
14 AND THE COMPTROLLER SHALL ACCOUNT FOR THE FUND.

15 (E) THE FUND CONSISTS OF:

16 (1) MONEY APPROPRIATED IN THE STATE BUDGET TO THE FUND;

17 (2) PRIVATE DONATIONS;

18 (3) INTEREST EARNINGS; AND

19 (4) ANY OTHER MONEY FROM ANY OTHER SOURCE ACCEPTED FOR
20 THE BENEFIT OF THE FUND.

21 (F) THE FUND MAY BE USED ONLY FOR CARRYING OUT THE PURPOSE OF
22 THE FUND.

23 (G) (1) THE STATE TREASURER SHALL INVEST THE MONEY OF THE FUND
24 IN THE SAME MANNER AS OTHER STATE MONEY MAY BE INVESTED.

25 (2) ANY INTEREST EARNINGS OF THE FUND SHALL BE CREDITED TO
26 THE FUND.

1 (H) NO PART OF THE FUND MAY REVERT OR BE CREDITED TO:

2 (1) THE GENERAL FUND OF THE STATE; OR

3 (2) ANY OTHER SPECIAL FUND OF THE STATE.

4 (I) EXPENDITURES FROM THE FUND MAY BE MADE ONLY IN ACCORDANCE
5 WITH THE STATE BUDGET.

6 (J) THE FUND IS SUBJECT TO AUDIT BY THE OFFICE OF LEGISLATIVE
7 AUDITS AS PROVIDED IN § 2-1220 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE.

8 5-907.

9 (A) THE VICTIM SERVICES UNIT SHALL ESTABLISH AN OVERSIGHT
10 COMMISSION TO ENSURE THAT THE PROGRAM IS BEING ADMINISTERED PROPERLY
11 AND THAT THE FUND IS BEING USED APPROPRIATELY.

12 (B) ON OR BEFORE DECEMBER 1 EACH YEAR, BEGINNING IN 2028, THE
13 VICTIM SERVICES UNIT SHALL SUBMIT A REPORT ON THE STATUS OF THE PROGRAM
14 TO THE GOVERNOR AND, IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 2-1257 OF THE STATE
15 GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY THAT INCLUDES:

16 (1) THE NUMBER OF INDIVIDUALS ACCEPTED INTO THE PROGRAM;

17 (2) THE NUMBER OF INDIVIDUALS WHO APPLIED FOR THE PROGRAM;

18 (3) THE TYPES OF SERVICES PROVIDED TO THE VICTIMS UNDER THE
19 PROGRAM;

20 (4) AN OUTLINE OF HOW THE FUND IS USED TO SUPPORT THE
21 PROGRAM;

22 (5) AN EVALUATION OF THE PROGRAM; AND

23 (6) ANY OTHER INFORMATION THAT MAY BE USEFUL IN
24 DETERMINING THE PROGRAM'S EFFECTIVENESS.

27 (a) (2) (i) This paragraph does not apply in fiscal years 2024 through 2028.

(iii) The provisions of subparagraph (ii) of this paragraph do not apply to the following funds:

14 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, for fiscal year 2028, the
15 Governor shall include in the annual budget bill an appropriation of \$10,000,000 to the Gun
16 Violence Victim Relocation Program Fund established under Title 5, Subtitle 9 of the Public
17 Safety Article, as enacted by Section 1 of this Act.

18 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July
19 1, 2026.
